Happy New Year! I am praying that God continues to bless your family with love and peace throughout the year.

Please note, the following is a recommendation from the DRVC Department of Education, NOT due to any current positive COVID19 case in our school community

After monitoring the spike of COVID-19 cases in the days following Christmas and in the interest of safely remaining open over the winter months, Our Lady of Peace School has decided it is in our best interest to conduct remote learning on the first two days following the Christmas break- Monday, January 4, 2021, and Tuesday, January 5, 2021. We will resume in-person instruction on Wednesday, January 6, 2021. We are shifting to remote learning on Monday and Tuesday to pass the five-day primary incubation period of COVID-19 after New Year's Eve.

By remaining closed these two additional days, I hope to preemptively stop individuals who may have contracted COVID-19 and not yet developed symptoms from exposing our school community to the COVID-19 virus.
