The “Vision Statement” for our collaborative states: “To renew the presence of Christ in our Community by being disciples and stewards of Jesus Christ.”

The core council for our Catholic Community of New Bedford North met on Monday night June 14, 2021 in the Unsworth Center to act on that vision. Msgr. Oliveira, Fr. Raposo and our soon to be new Co-Pastor, Fr. Sudhir Nayak were in attendance. Guided by Laura Carrillo from the Diocesan Strategic and Pastoral Planning Office **the council has decided to recommend to the Bishop to unify the three parishes into one new parish.** As part of this process, we will be opening the Parishes of St. Joseph-St. Therese and Our Lady of Fatima effective the weekend of June 26-27, 2021 according to the following schedule.

Saturday at 4:00PM at St. Joseph-St. Therese

Sunday at 8:00AM at Our Lady of Fatima

**Sunday at 10:30AM and 7:00PM at
St. Mary's Church.**

This schedule will continue through October. A tentative date of October 10, 2021 is scheduled for Bishop da Cunha to join us to inaugurate our new Parish community. At that time a new parish will be formed from all three parishes and worshiping together at St. Mary's Church. It is our hope that these next few months will offer us the opportunity to accept each other as one family of God as we say farewell to the Parishes of St. Joseph-St. Therese and Our Lady of Fatima and St. Mary's.

The Catholic Community of New Bedford North was created for this very purpose – to unite the communities of three individual parishes into one powerful community in the north end of New Bedford to serve the spiritual and material needs of the people of the north end. Admittedly this unification has come a bit sooner than expected, however, several factors have contributed to this decision including financial considerations and only two priests to meet the needs of three parishes. Please continue to pray for our Collaborative as we journey in faith together.

Bishop da Cunha and regional bishops to lift the Sunday and Holy Day Mass dispensation

Bishop Edgar M. da Cunha, S.D.V., and regional Catholic bishops have together decided to inform the Catholic faithful that the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Day Mass obligation will be lifted on Father’s Day, June 19-20. The bishops saw Father’s Day weekend as an appropriate time to encourage Catholic faithful, especially families, to return to the Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, the center of every Catholic life.

The obligation does not apply to those who are ill, recently exposed to COVID-19 or other communicable illnesses, those confined to their homes or other facilities for various reasons, and those who are not able to be vaccinated for specific reasons.

The full official release of the bishops’ statement will be posted on The Anchor website at anchornews.org and the diocesan website, fallriverdiocese.org.

Inspiration for the week

God calls us to bring His Word to all corners of the earth. What does that mean for you and me? We are just simple and humble folks trying to find our way through the Gospel and our world. After all, we are not professional preachers but gentle servants. Jesus summons us to take his message on the road and bring it from the pew to the pavement. We cannot keep the joy of the Gospel to ourselves but must bring it into every aspect of our lives: our families, our schools, our work, our corporations, our politics, our social circles, and our philosophies. We cannot just accept the wisdom of the world as true and conduct our lives as if the Good News is a separate matter. They are one. Jesus never asked his friends to go and construct buildings where people could come to hear the truth. He asked them to go to their homes and meet them one on one, face to face. When the rubber meets the road and the message is challenging, rejection is quite possible. That's the litmus test for whether we're really doing what we have been asked.

Registration for Faith Formation 2021-22 has begun!

Just access the online registration portal through our website – www.ccnbn.org/youth-faith-formation -- use your debit or credit card for payment and you'll be good to go for another year. For those who still wish to pay by check or cash, there is a form available on the website to download and once it's filled out you can return it with payment to the Central Offices.

Please note – if your child/teen attends a Catholic school and wishes to begin preparation for the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation, they need to complete TWO YEARS of preparation in the Collaborative outside of their religious studies in school according to diocesan requirements. The traditional years to begin this process are in Grades 1 & 8 so please be aware of this before you complete the form.
