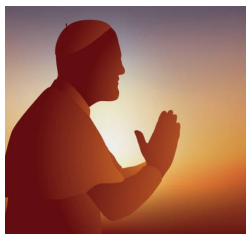

The Basilica of St. John Lateran is the cathedral of the diocese of Rome, the official ecclesiastical seat of the Holy Father. The Basilica contains many famous statues, including a collection of statues of the Apostles. It also has six extant tombs of Popes, ranging from the 11th century to Pope Leo XIII. The Lateran Basilica is also called, "mother and head of all the churches of the city and the world."

Christopher West will also be presenting a day-long seminar on the *Theology of the Body and the Holy Eucharist* at Sts.
