Contemporary music, including a rap piece, held the audience's attention as specific verses from the Gospels and the letters of Paul were displayed.

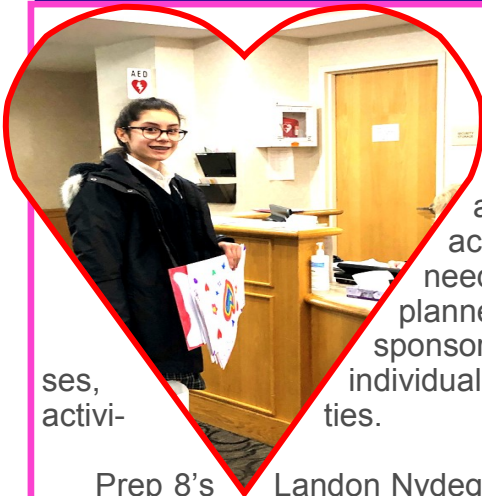

The students prepared the biographies in written form and designed presentation boards for the viewers to see photos and autographs.

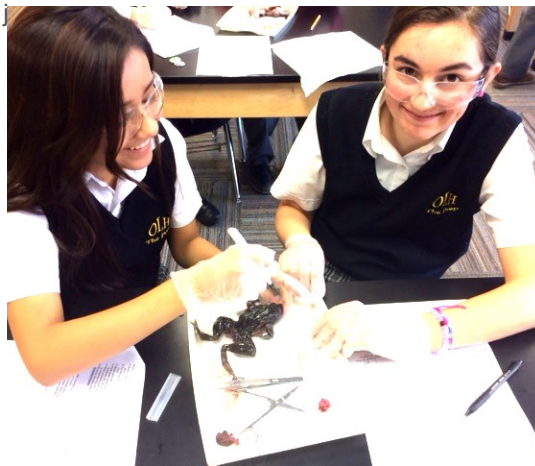
