Who was the thirteenth apostle?

My granddaughter says her teacher said there were thirteen apostles. Who is number thirteen?

When we recall the apostles, we usually think of the Twelve, an early tradition that the Church is a reconstituted Israel based on its original twelve tribes.

In the Gospels of Matthew (10:2–4), Mark (3:14–19), and Luke (6:13–16) and in Acts of the Apostles (1:13, 16–18), all twelve apostles are named. Each list begins with Peter, followed by Andrew, James, and John, with Judas always last. Then, except for Philip and Thomas (listed in all four Gospels and in Acts), varying translations are provided for the different names of the Twelve. John's Gospel, which does not name all twelve, adds Nathanael (1:45–51). Any of these could be mistaken for a thirteenth apostle.

But your granddaughter is probably talking about Matthias. When the apostles gathered to choose a replacement for Judas Iscariot, two men were nominated: Joseph, also called Barsabbas, and Matthias. Before they chose, the apostles prayed, "You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this apostolic ministry from which Judas turned away to go to his own place" (Acts 1:24–25).

Then they voted by casting lots (throwing pebbles or straws), and the lots fell on Matthias. From then on, Matthias was counted as one of the twelve apostles.

Condition

The two (2) ~100 years old life size sculptures; Sacred Heart of Jesus and Blessed Virgin Mary, have accumulated surface contaminants throughout, especially concentrated on the folds and creases of the statues. They have been exposed to inconsistent temperatures and humidity levels through out years, causing the <u>pigment to flex and fissure</u>. Pigment has flaked off in various places to varying degrees. The outer coating is deteriorating; both the outer coating and inner layer are cracking. In addition, <u>the authentic pigment and (22K) gold leaf trims have been overlaid with different paint</u> applications on several periodical occasions; creating a rough imitation of the original artist palette.

Procedures

The two sculptures are to be chemically cleaned to remove all surface contaminants.

Areas with salvageable pigment will be secured with appropriate bonding agents and sealed. Other areas may be overlaid with base material where permissible.

The remaining areas will have their surface coating (pigments) stripped; allowing the inner layer to be chemically cleaned and overlaid with the same base material.

All fissures and deficiencies are to be sanded, filled in and prepared for finishing applications.

Colors will be restored to their original hue with the appropriate pigment in all prepared areas to create a harmonious and authentic finish, as well as aesthetic improvement. In general the existing dull finish will be replaced with a rejuvenated fresh look, maintaining the historical integrity of the piece.

The existing, <u>painted gold trims</u> will be replaced with <u>gold leaf</u>. The two finishes pieces will have a sealer applied for enhancement and added protection of surface pigment and patina.

This is the same company that restored our Stations of the Cross and Baptismal Font. Their proposal for restoring and repairing these statues is in the Bulletin. The statues should be restored and put back into place by late September. We are accepting donations to cover the cost of restoring these statues. 
