## Wising Up

here are various kinds of wisdom: the kind you get by watching carefully to discover how something works, or by learning from a mistake; the wisdom in taking advice from someone and not making the mistake he made; the political, social, or religious wisdom learned by those who work in these vocations. There is also wisdom that is just beyond our reach, the kind that is found only in God.


This Sunday's readings discuss various kinds of wisdom. King Solomon asks for "a listening heart" (1 Kings 3:9), the knowledge needed to rule his people wisely. He is told he can ask for anything: long life, riches, security from his enemies, all blessings that would certainly benefit him. Instead he asks for something to benefit his people. It seems he is wise enough to know he needs such wisdom. The psalm response praises the law, the religious tradition that provides instruction for living a life of holiness and thus reaping the rewards of such a life.

The parable in the Gospel describes various life situations in which decisions have to be made. In the first two instances, a question is posed: What is the kingdom of heaven worth to you? What are you willing to give up in order to attain it? The third depicts fishing with a net, a very strenuous task. A question here might be: Are you willing to work hard at this? Are you discerning in separating good actions from bad? It takes real wisdom to answer such questions.

# Should we send our child to a Catholic school? Luckily, we can afford it. But what are the advantages?

n a Catholic school your child will be exposed to faith development and to religious, moral, and disciplinary values that some public schools can't impart. This is in addition to a high-quality general education. A 2019 study by the National Center for Education Statistics shows that the all-important math and reading assessments for Catholic school fourth- and eighth-graders surpassed those of their public school cohorts.

A well-run Catholic school can offer your child an educational experience and life formation based on the message, values, and principles of Jesus Christ. These are the preeminent reasons to choose a Catholic school. You want your child to hear the story of Jesus, to know and admire him, to grow up as one of his devoted friends and disciples.

Children need to see the message of Jesus lived out enthusiastically by their parents, teachers, and the adult faith community, of which the school is a part. Catholic schools will teach a value system clearly rooted in Jesus' gospel message. The children will discover that God's creation is good, to



be respected and cared for. The children will sense and appreciate their own intrinsic worth as human beings and the dignity of everyone. They will develop sensitivity to the poor and less fortunate. In short, children need the faith formation that a Catholic school offers.



## Safe Environment Training WITH Background Check Getting Started:

**New to training?** Create an account by completing all the boxes under "**Register for a New Account**". This includes address, primary parish, and how you participate at your parish or school. If you have questions please contact your safe environment coordinator. **Please do not create a new account if you completed VIRTUS after 2012 - you will already have an account in the system.** 


**Previous VIRTUS training?** Click the "Sign In" button in the upper right corner of the page and use your VIRTUS username and password: **1234**. You will be prompted to update to a more secure password. Once signed in, you can update your account information from the "Edit Profile" tab.

- 2. Your dashboard will show you the required and optional training curriculums that have been customized for your particular category within the Archdiocese.
- 3. Click **Start** under **Safe Haven Training Mandatory for all employees and volunteers** to begin.
- 4. On the last page of the curriculum, submit your background check information. Please enter your name as listed on your government issued identification.

**NOTE:** The training will show as *Resume* until your background check is processed and reviewed by the Archdiocese. This can take up to 7-10 business days.




- On your main dashboard, you will click **Start** to open up the training.
- Complete each training page—as you work through, they will show as Done in each box.
- When finished, click **Dashboard**. Your curriculum will show as *Resume* on your dashboard until your background check is processed and approved.

**NOTE:** Background checks can take up to 7-10 business days to process.

 After you are certified, you can log in to your account to access your completion certificate.
 Click the gray **Print Certificate** button under the completed training.

**NOTE:** If you have a valid email address on your account, you will receive a system message when approved.


