

# Once Upon a Mountaintop

any people, perhaps most people, have had a religious experience of some sort, something akin to that of Peter, James, and John atop the mountain with Jesus. It may or may not have included hearing a voice. Most often it is a deep sense of God's presence beyond anything they have ever known, like a profound realization of what life is about or how it is taced through and through with God. It usually occurs as we are idle, not doing anything in particular, and often when we are younger, yet it is also something that changes our understanding of what tife and God are about.

Most people do not talk about such experiences for any number of reasons, partly because there do not seem to be words to describe such a moment in a way anyone would understand, like trying to describe falling in love. Partly because if we tried, we fear others would think us strange. And partly because we can find ourselves wondering whether it was real or simply our imagination. Yet always we remember the moment and know it to be true.


One additional characteristic of such moments is that they tend to take us to a new place in life, as with Abram in the first reading. For him it was to pack up his life and move. More likely for us it is to a life of service, caring, and treasuring all of life now in a new way.

Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him."



### Dear Padre,

### What is the value of lighting a candle in church?

Lighting candles is one of many customs that can be found in most of the world's religions. Lit candles, in church or at home, in front of a picture or statue of a favorite saint, serve a symbolic function. The light of the candle represents our desire that our prayer may be constant, as St. Paul urged (1 Thessalonians 5:17). The candle burns while we go about our daily tasks, symbolizing our desire to be at prayer with God. Similarly, Tibetan Buddhists spin prayer wheels and believe that as long as the wheels spin, a prayer is offered. Candles give light and banish the darkness. For Catholics they symbolize the light of Christ, by whose death and resurrection we are saved.



Lighting a candle isn't a required act. You can pray without lighting candles, without statues, without anything but your faith in God. However, we Catholics love our symbols. We like to engage all of our senses in our prayer experience: beautiful churches, colored light, incense, great music and, yes, candles.


One extreme position to avoid is lighting a candle hoping it will cause something else to happen, like the sudden cure of a loved one or relief from financial ruin. We are to avoid all appearance of using candles as if they have an untapped, magical power. Nevertheless, lighting a candle as a part of our prayer is a comforting custom and most things (and people?) look lovelier by candlelight.

# Stewardship

In the midst of a prayer meeting in a large downtown church, with several hundred people present, a timid little woman arose to speak. It was in the midst of the Lenten season and the pastor had asked a rather simple, but searching question: "Suppose you had the chance to be one person associated with those last days of Jesus in Jerusalem, whom would you choose to be?" The woman was trying to reply to that question.

sion story whose place I could never fill," she said. "I could not carry my Master's cross as Simon of Cyrene did. Nor could I have followed him out to the garden as some of the others did. But, I could make ready for him the best room in my house, where he might eat the last supper with his disciples. I could promise him that it would be made ready to his satisfaction."

There was something very simple in her testimony, but those who knew the little woman were well aware of the truth in her words: "...it would be made ready to his satisfaction." She was that kind of a person.

Someone had to make ready a room and furnish it. There is no record of any such thing in the Scripture, but it is easy to imagine some housewife telling her Christian friends, years afterward, how the Lord had come to their home that




night and had eaten that last solemn meal under her roof. She never wrote a gospel nor became a martyr, nor did she hold an office in the church, but she could provide a furnished room!

A great deal of the service of the kingdom of God must be rendered by those who never get their names into the papers, are never publicly commended, and are never elected as a delegate. But there is need for a furnished upper room and some devoted heart furnishes it without thought of publicity or commendation. In the eternal records of God the name is inscribed and after it the notation clearly written: "Well done, thou good and faithful steward."

Christian stewardship is nothing less than a way of life. It is the understanding that everything we have, including our own lives, is a gift from God. It is a way of looking at the world ... at everything that touches our lives ... through the eyes of faith.





ll people complain that they haven't enough time. They look at their lives from too human a point of view. There is always time to do what God wants us to do, but we must put ourselves completely into each moment that God offers us.

The following excerpt from the prayer of Michel Quoist exemplifies many of our lives and provides food for thought with regards to how we spend our time.

"I went out, Lord. People were coming and going, walking and running.

Everything was rushing: cars, trucks, the street, the whole town. People were rushing not to waste time. They were rushing after time, to catch up with time, to gain time.

Goodbye, Sir, excuse me, I haven't time. I'll come back, I can't wait, I haven't time. I'd love to help you, but I haven't time. I can't accept, having no time. I can't think, I can't read, I'm swamped, I haven't time. I'd like to pray, but I haven't time.

You understand, Lord, they simply haven't the time. The child is playing, he hasn't time right now ... Later on ... The schoolboy has his homework to do, he hasn't time ... Later on ... The student has his courses, and so much work ... Later on ... The grandparents, have their grandchildren ... they haven't time.

And so all men and women run after

time, Lord. In spite of all their efforts they're still short of time. Lord, you must have made a mistake in your calculations. There is a big mistake somewhere. The hours are too short, the days are too short, our lives are too short. For time is a gift that you give us, but a perishable gift; a gift that does not keep.

Lord, I have time. All the time that you give me, the years of my life, days of my years, the hours of my days. They are all mine. Mine to fill completely, to the brim ... to offer them to you."

Check to see where your time goes. How much does Christ and the church get?

During this Lenten season and for the rest of the year we have a chance to give back a little of what has been given to us. There are a number of ways to show our love by giving our time, our money, or our talents. We must learn to give every day to add our little bit to that which Christ gave to us during that Easter season long ago.



od has taught that you cannot love without giving. God so loved you that he gave his Divine Son. And the son so loved you that he gave his life on the cross for you. Now it is our turn to show our love. During Lent, a time of prayer and penance, think seriously of your need to be responsible to demonstrate your love.

### Stewardship is accountability

Be aware that to Christ all of life is stewardship and that we are all responsible to the God who made us for every capacity with which we have been endowed. Someone once asked Daniel Webster about the greatest thought he ever had. Without a moment's hesitation, Mr. Webster replied, "The greatest thought my mind has ever grasped is my accountability to Almighty God." Stewardship is the means by which we satisfy that accountability, for it places every man on his own feet. It makes him a steward of what he has, and is, and can become.

### Good disciples

In a very real sense it is the only way we can be sure that we have been good disciples of Christ ... that we have carried our full share of the work of the kingdom, and that, in some small way, we have helped to make the Word become flesh in our life and time.

good friend of mine just spent the weekend with a group of junior high kids. I have enough trouble handling my own two teenagers let alone a weekend in a hotel with a hundred kids! He actually enjoys it! He doesn't get paid for doing this. Paul has touched so many young people with the love of Christ and has had such an impact on their decisions, their futures, and their home life.

It's amazing to see kids who are hungry for God and enjoy studying God's word and telling others about what he's done in their lives. Why would a man give of his time so freely to do such challenging work? He laughs when I call it challenging. He sees it as only rewarding.

Paul has made me realize that when you have an eternal perspective on your daily activities, it helps you see much more clearly what's really important and what's not. Who knows how many lives will be touched and changed through these kids that he is having such an impact on? The stewardship of time is one our greatest privileges and yet one of our biggest responsibilities. Who's eternity will you impact today?

### **Loaves & Fishes**

oaves & Fishes Watertown serves a nutritious meal every Monday evening. Their mission statement is: "To feed the mind, body and spirit through the unconditional love of Christ." It started when Linda Lippens and members of the church acknowledged a personal call to action from the Lord. But the call seemed so vague; what field, where do they serve?

Linda and team attended a Missional Leadership Process meeting led by their pastor. Using the information from that meeting, Linda and a committee of eight spent the next two years prayerfully going into the community to determine missional needs. A considerable need was the hungry and the homeless. Linda then contacted the Watertown Moravian Church because of its central location and its facilities.

A plan was formulated and a practice meal was held with 150 people served. June 1st was the first official Loaves & Fishes meal. During this time, Linda, her husband, Gregg, and a core team was developed. Over 8,000 meals have been served since that time under Linda's and Gregg's leadership of the group. Other services have been implemented, such as a Prayer Box, monthly blood pressure readings, and a clothing drive. Other types of services are being thought of, and with God's help will be provided! Linda said she has felt God's hand throughout this process.

Thank you Linda and Gregg and team for being such an outstanding example of Stewardship for us all!

### Not to Be Served But to Serve

The words of Matthew 20:28 - "Just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many" - remind us that the life of Jesus was one of total sacrifice. It is clear that Jesus wanted to develop a servant spirit in his disciples and in us. He said in Matthew 20:26, "... whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant." He lived for his heavenly Father and for others. In the same way Jesus served his Father, we exist to serve him. Being conformed into the image of God we will take on the role of servants.

The concept of serving rather than being served is not a natural one. We have an inborn desire to want to be served ourselves and to have our own needs met rather than to see to others. We by nature prefer to be "number one". In addition, our apathy contributes to our lack of interest in sharing. God loves changing our mindset from wanting attention for ourselves to serving others. Seeing others as our brothers and

sisters in Christ helps us to follow God's command to love our neighbor as ourselves (Mark 12:31).



A life of service and servanthood is contrary to what our society promotes. We are told that we should aspire to fame, power, and wealth. In servanthood there is no glory, spotlight, or fame. A meaningful relationship with Christ is not possible if we put ourselves first and only seek the goals that are important to the world we live in. Living a life of service, we give of ourselves without striving for financial rewards or glory. Unlike the praise we receive from God, worldly praise has no lasting value. Along with the Apostle Paul we say, "We


are not trying to please men but God, who tests our hearts" (1 Thessalonians 2:4). As a servant, Jesus was not looking for praise from the masses, because he was only interested in glorifying his Father.

Second Corinthians 12:15 says, "So I will gladly spend for you everything I have and expend myself as well." Because of our desire to serve Jesus, we begin to identify with the interest that he has in other peoples' lives. We forego our interests and begin to live a life of Christian service. "You, my brothers, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather, serve one another in love" (Galatians 5:13).

Our freedom should express itself in the form of service. God brings us into a proper relationship with himself so we can understand what service he expects from us. Jesus lived a life of compassion for others. He continually served the hungry, handicapped, and homeless, and we are called to be imitators of Christ (Ephesians 5:1). When we commit to serving others, it is not done for our own satisfaction or to put ourselves on a pedestal. We serve out of love for Christ and to be worthy of his calling.

Tithing is not a gimmick to solve the economic problems of churches; it is a significant act of remembering who we are.

# Jesus Shows His Glory




In today's Gospel reading


