Together, we stand; divided, we fall! One of the beautiful and commendable characteristics of our faith community and indeed of Tweed in general is that we stand in solidarity, we stand together. This community spirit, neighbourliness and solidarity is manifest in our festivals and social events. It is even dominant in the event of death with massive turn-outs at visitations and funeral celebrations. This means that people are standing up for one another in joy, pain, sorrow, suffering and bereavement. These acts of kindnesses, no matter how small are never wasted. When we are one with our fellow men and women, with families and suffering people, life becomes richer and more meaningful. We enter into their predicament and feel with them. The corollary is that when we can no longer identify with the plight of others and sincerely reach out to them in compassion, gradually, we alienate ourselves, live in our own ivory towers and lose the capacity to be truly human. This is one of the key lessons the readings of this weekend convey to us as we reflect on the story of the rich man and Lazarus. In fact, when we cannot feel with and cannot love others, then, we are truly poor! Ironically, the rich man ended up begging: "Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue." The real meaning of life is to live, not for ourselves but for others, and for their welfare. By living for others, we live even more fully because the smiles we put on people's faces bounce back to us like tennis balls. This weekend, the call is to continue to strive to be people for others following the example of the Lord Jesus who by his life and ministry of compassion, was truly a man for others. He has taught us "that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again." (2Cor. 5:15).

October is the month of the Holy Rosary. Why pray the Rosary especially in October? The liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7. This Memorial and the Rosary Month were instituted to honour Our Blessed Mother Mary in gratitude for the protection she gives to the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful. The Rosary is one of the best known Catholic devotions. If you have been negligent in praying the Holy Rosary, please, use this October as a wake-up call to revive it in your prayer life. As a community, we shall pray the Rosary on Sundays, 30 minutes before the commencement of Mass in each church.
