Season of Advent

This weekend, we begin a new Liturgical Year 2021/2022, with the celebration of the First Sunday of Advent, Cycle "C." "Advent has a twofold nature: It prepares us for Christmas, when we recall Christ's first coming among us, and it is also a time when we look forward to his second coming at the end of the ages" (ORDO 2021/2022 p. 73). The holy season of Advent is consequently marked by a spirit of joyful expectation, of anticipation, of preparation, of longing. There is yearning for deliverance from the evils of the world, first expressed by the people of Israel as they cried out from their bitter oppression. Today, it is intended for us Christians as a period of spiritual preparation to make ourselves ready for the coming or birth of the Lord, Jesus Christ. We are called upon to be attentive to prayer, repentance, a spirit of sharing and anticipation of joy and hope. The Advent wreath expresses these spiritual aspirations.

"This Advent, we in Catholic parishes across Canada will be accompanying in prayer the delegation of Indigenous Peoples to Rome, where they will speak to Pope Francis of some truths that are difficult to hear, including how we in the Church have been the source of some deep pain and wounds. This Advent we are being invited to listen, to come to know, and in the words of our penitential rite, to acknowledge what we as church - and as society - have done and what we have failed to do in the history of relationship with Indigenous Peoples." (Homily of Most Rev Donald Bolen, Archbishop of Regina). In this light and in line with the Gospel's call to stay awake, we as Church and society have not been fully awake to Indigenous Peoples, their experiences, gifts, wisdom, suffering, etc. In the spirit of Advent and in the spirit of the Truth and Reconciliation process, we need to pray for a renewed mind, a spirit of greater openness and a spirt of reconciliation.

"Lord God, Creator of all that is, teach us to walk in your paths, to walk together even as you walk with us. Walk with the Indigenous delegation to Rome, and with all of us upon their return, that we might be true artisans of healing, justice and reconciliation. Through Christ our Lord, Amen."
