## **Humility in Giving and in Receiving**

I personally find the words of Sirach in our first reading thought-provoking, for he praises the person who is humble in his or her dealings with others as being far better than the person who is generous with his or her time and resources. Indeed, at the end of the day, we do not remember exactly what a person does for us per se, but we remember how he or she made us feel good, worthy, respected, accepted and loved. It is the good memory of our encounter with the person that will leave an imprint on our hearts and minds rather than what the person actually did for us. The truth is that even in giving and helping others, some lack the genuine motive and personal touch in rendering assistance. Some give, more for themselves than for those they intend to help. They give so that they can be honored, recognized and acknowledged. In that case, they are egoistic like the guests at the dinner the Lord noticed how they picked the places of honor. They want to be known and be seen as VIPs. We can therefore understand and appreciate why Sirach warns us of the dangers of pride. "When calamity befalls someone proud, there is no healing, for an evil plant has taken root in them." In a similar vein, the Book of Proverbs says, "Pride goes before destruction. And a haughty spirit before a fall" (Prov 16:18). When we are proud and egoistic, we perceive ourselves as better than others and want people to put us on a pedestal. In our superiority complex, we glorify ourselves in our riches, talents, position and resources. That is why pride is the root of all rebellion. Satan's sin was to rebel against the authority and power of God. He wanted to be God without submitting to the authority of God. This is the real downfall of humanity. Today, humanity has made phenomenal advancements in science and technology. He has sent spaceships to the moon and now to Mars. He thinks the world's problems can be solved only by his ingenuity and intelligence. He thinks he does not need God. Some claim that God is dead! This is the root of secularism and humanism and the New Age Philosophy which claims that there is no God because they are the manifestation of God! So, humanity has pushed God out of his sight because of pride, arrogance and false autonomy. Sirach cautions us about these trends and draws our attention to the key to wisdom and love, namely, humility. Those with a humble heart are always willing to learn from God and from others. They know that they are limited in knowledge and understanding. Therefore, when we give or share our resources with others, we must always remain humble in service and generosity.
