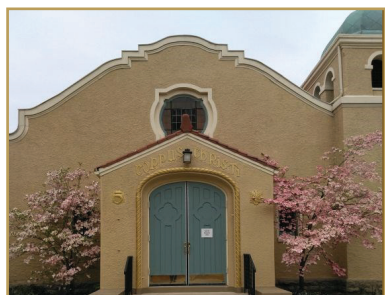

The Real Presence

THE MIRACLE OF MIDDLEBURG - LOUVAIN, BELGIUM 1374

The name of the noble lady who is mentioned in the history of this miracle is long forgotten, but it is known that she was a wealthy native of Middleburg (located in the southwest section of the Netherlands). She was kind to her domestics and so concerned for their spiritual welfare that she herself taught them the traditions of the Catholic Church. On the first Sunday of Lent in 1374, as was her custom, she encouraged her servants to prepare for the season by going to confession and receiving Holy Communion. However, they only acted out of a duty they had to perform. One of the servants, known only as Jean of Cologne, feeling obligated to participate with the others for fear of being disgraced, knelt with the others to receive Holy Communion without having confessed his sins in the Sacrament of Penance. But as soon as the Host was placed on Jean's tongue, it turned to flesh, which he was unable to swallow! Frightened by this, he attempted to hide his difficulty, but then made the mistake of biting into the flesh. At that moment three drops of blood fell from his lips, staining the cloth covering the Communion railing. Startled by the bloody flesh in Jean's mouth, the priest promptly removed the Host and respectfully carried it to the altar and placed it in a small gold vessel. Jean, being punished for his sacrilegious Communion, was instantly blinded. Feeling overwhelming remorse for his sin, he knelt at the feet of the priest and confessed his sin before the entire congregation. His sincere sorrow resulted in the restoration of his sight. Thereafter, it is said that Jean led an exemplary life and maintained to his death a great reverence for the Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. The Host itself and the bloodstained cloth have been transferred a number of times to various churches and monasteries. In 1380, the Host, still bearing the impression of the teeth that marked its bloody origin, was discovered to have miraculously divided itself into two parts, one part remaining in a church in Cologne, the other half transferred to a monastery Louvain, Belgium. 1

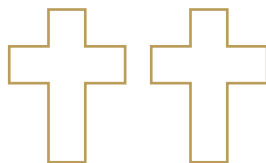
