

# GOSPEL MEDITATION 3rd Sunday of Easter

I always feel a little sad when someone begins to speak to me with the words, "Father, I know you're so busy, but ..." It happens a lot. And I get it. He or she is trying to be respectful of my time. But it saddens me because a priest makes Jesus present to people in a special way, and Jesus *always* has time for us. Don't we all feel at times that God just doesn't have time for us?

Nonsense. Just look at the stunning "Road to Emmaus" story we hear this week. It's the day Jesus rose from the dead. And the Risen One appears in disguise to two disciples. He walks with them, chats with them, and eventually eats with them. It could have been hours he spends with them — two unnamed persons — in the middle of nowhere. On the day he rose from the dead!

My friends, please take this to heart: The Risen Jesus is not too busy to spend time with you! He doesn't have "better things to do." You and I are members of this crucified and risen Body. He therefore has all the time in the world to be with us. So, I challenge you this week to approach him confidently in prayer and conversation. ## "Queen Of Martyrs" Name For Parish

The Catholic parish to be located in the Northridge area will be named "Queen of Martyrs," it was announced Saturday with the filing of a deed to the land in the name of Archbishop John T. Mc-Nicholas of Cincinnati, as trustee for the parish. Organization of the parish and construction of necessary buildings will be postponed until after the war, or until such time as building material becomes available for this purpose. The property is located on the west side of the Dixie highway in Northridge.

Two new Catholic parishes now await development in the Dayton area, the other being St. Raymond parish, to be located at some future date on the east side of Salem avenue north of the Miami Valley Golf club.

## The Real Presence MIRACLE OF SIENA, ITALY 1730

On August 14,1730, during devotions for the vigil of the Feast of Assumption, most of the population and clergy of the city of Siena, Italy were in attendance. Taking advantage of the friars' absence, thieves entered the deserted Church of St Francis, found the tabernacle. picked the lock, and carried away the ciborium which contained consecrated Hosts. The theft was discovered the next morning when the priest celebrating Mass opened the tabernacle at Communion time. Later a parishioner found the lid of the ciborium lying in the street. The anguish of the parishioners forced the cancellation of the feast, the Archbishop offered public prayers of reparation, and civil authorities began a search for the Hosts and the thief. Two days later, on August 17, while praying in the Church of St. Mary of Provenzano, a priest noticed something white protruding from the offering box attached to his priedieu. Realizing that it was a Host, he informed the other priests of the church, the Archbishop, and the friars of the Church of St. Francis. The offering box was then opened in their presence. The number of Hosts found were exactly the same size and number the friars had determined to be in the ciborium - 348 whole Hosts and six halves. They were placed in a ciborium in the tabernacle of the church and the following day were carried by the Archbishop in solemn procession back to the Church of St. Francis. Fifty years later, on August 14,1780, the Minister General of the Franciscan Order tasted one of the Hosts and found it to be fresh and incorrupt. Since some of the Hosts had been distributed during the passing years, he ordered that the remaining 230 Hosts be placed in a new ciborium and forbade further distribution. In the past two centuries many investigations have been conducted to confirm the authenticity of the miracle. The miraculously preserved Hosts are displayed publicly on the 17th of each month and carried in procession on the feast of Corpus Christi. They have been cherished and venerated in the Basilica of St. Francis in Siena for over 250 years.

## 75th Year Queen of Martyrs Church

In 1941, Charles A Ertel offered a parcel of land for a new congregation in the North Ridge area. An unrecorded Trust Form Warranty Deed was presented to the Archbishop. While it had been a plan in process, materials were hard to find and, in 1942, it was decided the building of the church would wait until after the war. At this time the Archbishop did offer the name of the new congregation: Queen of Martyrs. This information was released to the public in December 1942.

- On February 21 the first meeting of the new family council Northeast Eight was held at Saint Benedict. The next meeting will be at the Our Lady of Mercy site of Our Lady of Grace Parish.
- At the first meeting, the family of Council members discuss their functions and roles in line with the Beacon of Light Principle.
- If any Parishioner has concerns, one will address them with one of the four members representing the Parish.
- The council will meet as one family of Northeast Eight on the third Tuesday of each month. Check your Web pages for the administrative plan of Northeast Eight Parishes.



Staff merging/arrangements is in progress.


There will be a staff member at each location working for some limited hours of time as needed.
