


The Most Holy Trinity

In my experience, one of the peculiarities of being a man is the somewhat unlikely ability to look into the mirror, no matter how out of shape he may be, and declare with full confidence: "Looking good, buddy!" Ask a man. He'll probably confirm it.

Therein lies a mystery. You might think I refer to man's ability to deceive himself or his propensity toward vainglory. But in this case, I refer to the mystery of a healthy and proper sense of self-love. We human beings (both men and women) have the utterly weird ability to look at ourselves as if we were another. Then we tend to love this "other." Then, somehow, that love becomes a bond between the two. We are three and yet one.

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday. We ponder anew that God in His unity is a play of multiplicity: Lover, Beloved, and shared Love. Or, as we also proclaim, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. If we allow it, this mystery heals our temptation toward self-hatred and destruction. We all know how awful it is to look into the mirror and not know the person we see, or, equally bad, to know and hate who we see. Jesus, the Son of God, draws us into the dynamics of authentic self-knowledge and self-love. Perhaps we could ask the Holy Trinity this Sunday to teach us to truly look at ourselves and to properly love who we see looking back.


Thanks to all!

St. Norbert Feast Day June 6

Born to nobility, St. Norbert of Xanten, was ordained as a subdeacon and served in the court of Henry V, Emperor of Germany, however, at court it was easy to be distracted by wealth, power and luxury and he lived a worldly and corrupt life there. By the grace of God while trav-

eling in a storm he was nearly struck by lightning and almost killed. This experience changed St. Norbert and he became penitent, left his court post, and after a period of discernment in a monastery, felt called to be a priest.

Norbert became an itinerant preacher, preaching against worldly attitudes but at the Pope's request finally settled in northern France and founded the Norbertine order established according to the rule of St. Augustine. The order grew rapidly and soon founded women's branch. Norbert traveled and preached across Germany where he also founded a lay branch of the Norbertines. In Belgium he preached against heresies which denied the Blessed Sacrament.

Eventually he was made Archbishop of Magdeburg, Germany, and later he traveled to Rome in support of Pope Innocent II, against the antipope. Afterward he returned to Germany to court of Emperor Lothar as advisor, at end of life, in failing health, St. Norbert was carried back to Magdeburg where he died.

The Real Presence

MIRACLE OF BRUSSELS, BELGIUM 1370

This Eucharistic miracle occurred at a time when certain Christians and Jews were embroiled in bitter opposition. In 1369.a Jewish man named Jonathan who lived in the little town of Enghien just 15 miles from Brussels had a friend named Jean living in Brussels. Jean, for some time, had simulated a conversion to Christianity. Jonathan repeatedly asked his friend to obtain for him some of the consecrated wafers used during Mass At first Jean was unwilling to comply, but when Jonathan promised him 60 gold coins to complete the task, greed overcame Jean's scruples and he immediately set about studying churches in Brussels for one in which he could secretly gain entrance. He finally chose the Church of St. Catherine, which was a small church used mainly to enshrine the Blessed Sacrament for distribution to the sick and was seldom attended by the sacristan. During the night of October 4, 1369, Jean, using a ladder, broke a window and slipped inside the church. He opened the tabernacle and found a golden ciborium containing 15 small Hosts and a large Host that was used for Benediction. After leaving the church undetected, he went immediately to Enghien and gave the Hosts to Jonathan who in return, gave him a bag containing the promised coins. Nothing more is known of the thief's fate, but it is known that Jonathan was murdered less than two weeks later. Jonathan's widow then moved to Brussels, taking the ciborium and Hosts with her. On April 4,1370, Good Friday, a number of Jews to whom the widow had given the Hosts assembled in their synagogue in Brussels. After laying the Hosts out on a table, they inflicted on them both verbal and physical abuse. Then, during this sacrilege, they drew out their knives and stabbed the Hosts. Immediately, before their stunned eyes, blood flowed from the stab wounds. Their knives fell from their trembling hands and they fell to the ground in terror. Then, in an effort to rid themselves of the bloody Hosts, 6 of which had been completely destroyed in the crime, the Jews persuaded a woman convert named Catherine to agree to take the Hosts to the Jews of Cologne. But, feeling full of remorse, she decided instead to tell the whole story to the cure' of the church of Notre Dame de la Chapelle, who then with a committee of churchmen reclaimed the Hosts from Catherine with great emotion. They left a few Hosts at the church, but the rest were taken in a magnificent procession of reparation in May of 1370 to the Cathedral of St. Michael and placed in a chapel there. During a period of unrest the Hosts were hidden in a recess in a beam of wood in St. Michaels. The faithful of Brussels still honor the miracle by visiting the chapel where the miraculous Hosts were kept.

But when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs, but one soldier thrust his lance into his side, and immediately blood and water flowed out. Jn 19:33-34

On Sept. 18, 1948, while at my office desk at the parish residence, 4311 N. Dixie dr. Northridge, I detected the order of smoke. Running to the rear window of the house I observed a grass fire making headway on the parish property. While in the act of calling up the chief of the fire department, Frank L. Haer, already the Fire Department was on the scene. I want to congratulate the chief and his crew for their ready response. If this fire had gained headway, there was danger of the parish house—only recently remodeled at the time at an expense of \$8000—going up in flames.

I mention this because there seems to be some adverse criticism concerning the North-ridge, fire department. No other
