


GOSPEL MEDITATION -ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Years ago, a woman at daily Mass approached me in the communion procession. She had her arms crossed, indicating she wanted a blessing instead of the Sacred Host. She had tears in her eyes. I gave her a little blessing. She returned the next day. And the next. The same thing repeated. After a few weeks, I asked her why she didn't receive Holy Communion. She said she wasn't Catholic yet and was preparing to become so. I asked her why she wanted to be Catholic. She said, "Because I long to be in a real communion with Christ and with everyone I love." That, I submit, is a darn good reason. A few months later, she became Catholic and received the Body and Blood of Christ with unspeakably great joy and still does to this day.

Saint Paul says of the Eucharistic bread, "Is it not a participation in the body of Christ?" For Paul, the answer is obvious. Yes, it is exactly that. Which is why he can say, "we, though many, are one body." Jesus is truly, really, and substantially present in the Holy Eucharist. This is no magic trick, but a mystery of our salvation. He feeds us with the Sacrament of his body so that our communion with him — and with the other members of his body — is built up and becomes mature. That's why the Eucharist quenches our deep thirst for love and communion. The Body and Blood of Christ is the best reason to be Catholic. It's our participation of love in the one we love.



The Real Presence

MIRACLE OF HASSELT, BELGIUM 1317

A visiting priest from a nearby town, had been assigned to help the priests in the city of Lummen, Belgium. He was asked to bring the Holy Eucharist to a man of the village who was ill. Taking with him a ciborium containing one Host, he entered the man's house, placed the ciborium on a table, and went into another room to speak with the man's family. While the priest was absent from the room in which he had entered, a man who was in the state of mortal sin wandered into the house, saw the ciborium and removed its cover. He touched the Host and then picked it up. At once the Host began to bleed. Frightened, the man dropped the Host into the ciborium and quickly ran out of the house. When the priest returned to the room for the ciborium, he found the cover removed and was astonished to see the Host spotted with blood. At first he was confused and didn't know what to do. He then took the ciborium to the pastor and related to him what had just happened. The pastor advised him to carry the miraculous Host to the church of the Cistercian nuns at Herkenrode, approximately 30 miles away. This convent, founded near Liege in the 12th century, was the first foundation of the Cistercian nuns in Belgium and ranked among the most important convents in the Low Countries. Because of this community's reputation for holiness, the pastor apparently felt that the miraculous Host would be more appropriately enshrined in the convent's church. The priest journeyed to the Cistercian church in Herkenrode, and as soon as he approached the altar and placed the Host upon it, a vision of Christ, crowned with thorns, was seen by everyone present. Because of this vision and the miraculous Host, Herkenrode quickly became one of the most famous pilgrimage locations in Belgium. The Host was securely kept in this church until 1796, when, during the French Revolution, the nuns were expelled from their convent. During that horrible time, the Host was entrusted to the care of a succession of different families. It is said that, for its safety, the Host was once placed in a tin box and walled into the kitchen of a family's home. In 1804, the Host was removed from hiding and taken during solemn procession to the Church of St. Quentin in Hasselt which still guards the miraculous Eucharistic Host of 1317. The Host remains in splendid condition.

Real Presence

Question:

How do you explain "Real Presence" to children?

Answer:

The first Communion class is filled with excitement to the point of bursting! They are just awestruck by every new thing they learn about Jesus. Their enthusiasm is contagious as they rattle off the names of the things in church, the vessels and vestments used at Mass, and the names of their pastors and priests. Of course, they know Christ can do anything because he's God. He comes to us in holy Communion because he loves us so much that he wants to be with us. And he comes to us in the form of bread and wine. We really receive him in the Eucharist.

Sometimes it is easier to explain this to children than to adults. Their faith and trust in Jesus is not limited by the questions and doubts that often come with the question of how he does it. Rather, they focus on the question "why," and the answer is something they can easily grasp: love. Christ wants to be with us because he loves us. Nothing is purer in truth or in faith. Not even the theological explanation of transubstantiation, or philosophical reasoning or symbolic references, come close. Christ takes on the form of bread and wine to be simple and approachable, so that no one is afraid or turned away. His love for us is complete and total. We try to love him the same way in return. For a child, it is simple. For us adults, we keep trying. "Unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 18:3). ©LPi

75th Year Queen of Martyrs Church

Many changes were occurring throughout Dayton and the Country. Throughout the area, the "war babies" were beginning to arrive. Anticipating an increase of student enrollments, many new school buildings were being constructed around the area. Although still in the process of building their first church, Queen of Martyrs jumped in to help. Plans for an eight-room school building, with an estimated budget of \$250,000 would be constructed for opening fall of 1950. Within the Queen of Martyrs parish were 300 children, who were currently going to Our Lady of Rosary, Holy Trinity, Our Lady of Mercy, Northridge and Butler Township Schools.

Within a month, the need became more urgent. Increased enrollment in the first grade for the 1949 school year made it impossible to wait until 1950 for the new school. Not only did the local schools were receive a huge increase in these first graders, they did not have funds to add more building space by the beginning of school 1949. In order to help, Father Buchheit decided to convert the auditorium within the new church building into two classrooms. These two classrooms would pull first and second graders from the other schools as they prepared the building of a new school.
