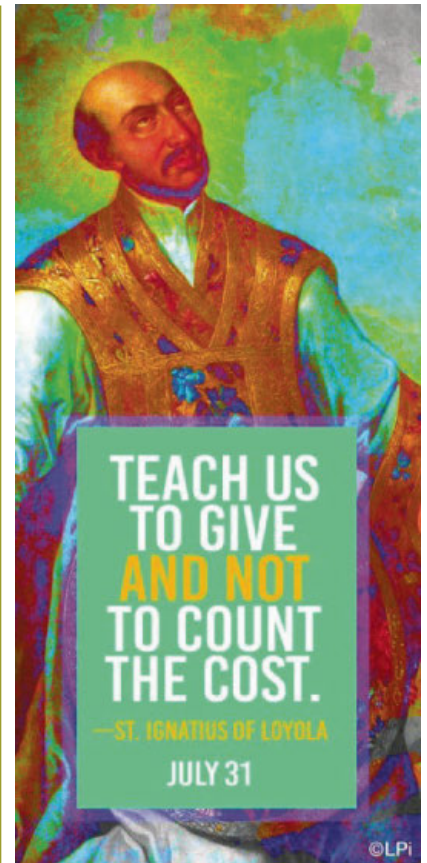

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Our culture seems more polarized and divided than ever. Into this wounded situation, our Catholic faith has a healing remedy to offer: the gift of wisdom. When the Lord offers to give King Solomon anything the monarch desires, he requests “an understanding heart” (1 Kings 3:9). In his polarized situation, the King doesn’t ask for power to defeat his enemies. He asks for a wise and understanding heart to judge right from wrong. This wisdom is elevated and fulfilled in Jesus who teaches us to bring forth “both the new and the old” (Matthew 13:52).

In our fractured society, we Christians should stop pining for political power to crush our perceived enemies. That often just makes things worse. Rather, it’s much more useful to beg for the grace of true wisdom which transcends both sides of the aisle. This places us in a fresh position from which we can help our culture see what is true and good all across the ideological spectrum. Sometimes we’ll look like liberals (e.g., in our love for the poor and marginalized) and other times like conservatives (e.g., in our sexual ethics and views on religious freedom). Because this wisdom is free from ideological narrowness, it will help to heal these painful fractures. Lord Jesus, this week, pour into us your healing wisdom.

The Real Presence

The religious fervor of the people of Ireland and their zealous allegiance to the Faith is well documented in Irish history. Prominent in Church history are several remarkable incidents that sustained the Irish during times of danger and trial. We learn of two of these occurrences as recorded in the writings of Wadding (d.1657), a historian and theologian.

In the early 17th century, Protestants undertook a fierce persecution against the Church. Priests were imprisoned or killed, ordinations were forbidden, and every manner of threat or abuse was suffered by the faithful. During this time, Wadding, a contemporary of the events, recorded that the Protestant Lord Deputy of Ireland once invited the whole council to a dinner. For entertainment he engaged a comedian to play the part of a fool. This Fleming being a subtle and crafty knave and understanding the council to be greatly delighted with such things as should be offensive to Catholics began to imitate them in celebrating the Holy Mass. Taking a mangel of bread, he said the words of consecration and lifted it up as the Catholics are used to do. In like manner taking a jug of beer, as he was lifting it up, he fell to the ground with the jug melted. The council was terrified, saying aloud (though not thinking so) that he was not dead, thinking to conceal the miracle, how it was manifestly known, and afterwards publicly declared to the confusion of all such heretics who should hear of it.

Another miracle took place in Waterford and demonstrated the grace accorded a group of people who had placed their trust in the Blessed Sacrament. James Daton, a Franciscan friar, was saying Mass in the city of Waterford in a secular man's house, when he was besieged round about by soldiers thinking to apprehend him at the very time of the Elevation. Those people present urged him to flee, but he requested that they not trouble him while he had his Master, the Holy Eucharist, in his hand; his Master who was more valiant than an army of soldiers such as they were. When the soldiers entered the house which was full of people they could see nothing but the white walls. It appeared to them to be empty. Even the priest at the altar with the Blessed Sacrament between his hands was invisible to the soldiers. This happened on the 18th of February in 1609.

Kissing the Altar at Mass

Question: Why do priests kiss the altar at the start of Mass?

Answer: Our churches and chapels are filled with symbols. We might think of the more common symbols (like the crucifix, statues, stained-glass windows, vestment color and altar cloths) as well as major symbols (such as the paschal candle and the baptismal font). But there are some things that we can take for granted in our sacred spaces, because unfortunately, they seem to just be part of the building, including three of the main symbols of our liturgy: the ambo (lectern), the chair for the priest celebrant, and the altar.

These three objects are placed in a specially designated area called the sanctuary. They are the places where the Word of God is proclaimed, where the priest prays and presides at the celebration, and where the bread and wine are offered by the priest during the Eucharistic Prayer. Although each of these objects is sacred because of the role they play in our worship, the altar holds a special place. In a document containing the rules and instructions for the Mass — the “General Instruction of the Roman Missal” — we read: “The altar on which the Sacrifice of the Cross is made present under sacramental signs is also the table of the Lord to which the People of God is called together to participate in the Mass, as well as the center of the thanksgiving that is accomplished throughout the Eucharist” (no. 296).

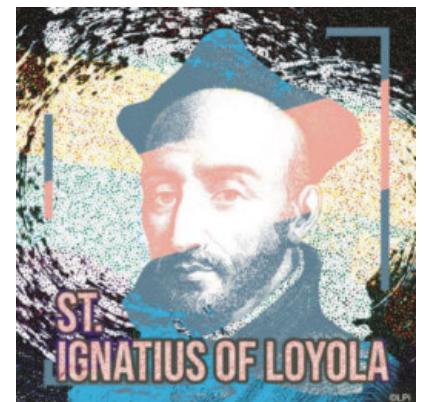
One of the ways that we recognize the importance of the altar is when the priest and deacon kiss the altar at the beginning of Mass. Kissing is an ancient act of devotion. Remember, we also kiss the cross on Good Friday, and the deacon or priest kisses the “Book of the Gospels” after the Gospel is proclaimed. This act of devotion reminds us that the altar is a symbol of Jesus, the “living stone” (see 1 Peter 2:4), the foundation stone of our faith. It is a symbol gesture, but it is a powerful reminder of the One on whom our faith is built and in whose name we gather as the “household of faith” (see Galatians 6:10).

Ignatius himself was constantly attuned to his own inner promptings. This self-knowledge -- open to the movements of the Holy Spirit -- led him to be an incredibly astute spiritual director. For Ignatius, recognizing God as the first principle of one's life determined everything. How has God changed you?

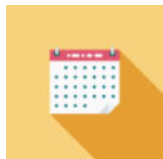

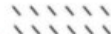

On June 14, 1930, Father William Buchheit was ordained in the Old Cathedral of St. Peter in Cains, by Bishop Joseph H Albers.

A Cincinnati native, Fr. Buchheit attended Xavier High School and Xavier University. He taught at Percell high school for five years and at Elder high school for ten years. Both in Cincinnati.

Fr. Buchheit served at St. Michael's church in Mechanicsburg and Our Mother of Sorrows church in Cincinnati prior to coming to Dayton to establish the Queen of Martyrs parish.

Father Buchheit marked his 25th anniversary with a solemn mass of thanksgiving in Queen of Martyrs church. A reception was held following the mass.
