As part of our Beacons of Light participation, our efforts continue to progress. We have entered Phase 2, which is Vision. During this phase, our family of parishes collaborate to define our family of parishes' Vision. We will have more information to share in November.

Our Holy Spirit Family of Parishes continues our welcoming efforts for our parishioners who have English as a second language. In August, there was a Cultural Food Festival held at St. Benedict the Moor. The Real Presence

EUCCHARISTIC FASTS

In his biography of St. Catherine of Siena (d. 1380) Bl. Raymond of Capua informs us that following a vision of Our Lord, food was no longer necessary to the saint. He writes that when Catherine was obliged to take food, she was so uncomfortable that it would not remain in her stomach and it would be quite impossible to describe her grievous pains on such occasions. At the start of her fast, the confessor who served her at the time commanded her to take food daily, but after a time the saint asked him: If therefore you see, by the numerous experiments of which you have been witness that I am killing myself by taking nourishment, why do you not forbid me, as you would forbid me to fast, if the fast produced a similar result? Bl. Raymond tells us that the confessor had nothing to reply to this reasoning, and said to her, "Henceforth act according to the inspiration of the Holy Ghost, for I perceive that God is accomplishing marvelous things in you. Sometime later, when her professor inquired whether she did not at least experience an appetite., Catherine replied, "God satisfies me so in the Holy Eucharist that it is impossible for me to desire any species of corporal nourishment." . On asking if she did not at least experience hunger on the days on which she did not communicate, the saint answered, "His sole presence satiates me, and I acknowledge that, to be happy, it even suffices for me to see a priest who has just said Mass. When Catherine's fast became well known many criticized her, and even religious persons were opposed to her. Some attributed the fast to "...a kind of vanity, that she did not fast really, but fed herself well in secret. Others said she wished to be noticed and that she was being deceived by the devil. Bl. Raymond writes: Catherine was willing to appease these murmurs, and determined that every day she would go once and take a seat at the common table and endeavor to eat. Although she used neither meat, nor wine, nor eggs, and did not even munch bread, what she took - or rather, what she tried to take - caused her such sufferings that those that saw her, however heart-hearted they were, were moved to compassion; her stomach could digest nothing, and rejected whatever was taken into it; she afterwards suffered the most terrible pains and her whole body appeared to be swollen; she did not swallow the herbs which she chewed, she only drew from them their juice and rejected their substance. She then took pure water to cool her mouth, but every day she was forced to throw up what she had taken, and that with so much difficulty that it was necessary to assist her by every possible means.

75th Year Queen of Martyrs

While the adults in the parish were making a name for the church with dances, festivals and smorgasbords, the children in the parish school were making a name for Queen of Martyrs.

By 1959, the boys football team won the CYO American League Championship. This first year they traveled to Olean, New York. Queen of Martyrs team was unfortunately defeated.

That's The Way Cookie Crumbles

OLEAN, N.Y.—Queen of Martyrs, Dayton CYO football team, scored two touchdowns in the last four minutes of the game to defeat Hauts Cookies 14 to 6 here yesterday.

Joe Budick scored both of the Queen of Martyrs touchdowns, which wiped out a 6-0 lead of the Olean team.

Queen of Martyrs, which leads the American league, will meet Holy Family in the league play-off Sunday at the University of Dayton stadium.

Queen of Martyrs first traveled to New York last year to meet Hauts and lost.

The following year, as the 1960 CYO American League Champions, “the party of 76-the tea, coaches, trainers, cheerleaders, and some parents – will travel in two buses. On the agenda for the weekend will be sight-seeing, attending a college football game and of course, a little pre-game practice.” They succeeded in defeating Hauts’ Cookies 14 – 6.

Heading back to Dayton, the Queen of Martyrs team played Holy Family at the University of Dayton Stadium. With a score of 12-6, Queen of Martyrs took the CYO Title!

The rubber match was played in October 1961 at Northridge High Stadium. Queen of Martyrs won 42 to 24. The following month, they traveled to St. Louis for the intersectional clash of CYO squads. Queen of Martyrs took the St. Louis team 26-12.
