The Sacrament of Baptism

Attendance at a baptismal class is required for parents who desire baptism for their infant. Godparents must both be Catholic, fully initiated into the Church at least 16 years old, and practicing their faith. The date and time of baptism will be determined by the pastor. Baptismal preparation classes can be attended prior to the birth of your child. Please contact the parish office to inquire.

The RCIA: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a process by which an adult enters into the Catholic Church. RCIA classes begin in the fall of the year. The sacraments of initiation are received at the Solemn Vigil in the Holy Night of Easter.

The Sacrament of the Eucharist
The children of the parish are prepared to receive their First Holy Communion in the second grade. The reception of the sacrament takes place at a Sunday Mass in the spring of each year. If your child is beyond the second grade and has not yet received their First Holy Communion, please call the parish for information about preparation to receive the sacrament.

The Sacrament of Confirmation

The Youth of the parish are prepared to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in grades 8 and 9. It is a two year program.

The youth will receive the sacrament from the Bishop of Lansing in October of their 2nd year in a regional Confirmation Mass. The sacrament of Confirmation completes full initiation into the Catholic Church. If you are an adult and have not been confirmed please call the parish office to inquire about the reception of the sacrament.

The Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation

The children of the parish are prepared to receive their First Penance in the second grade prior to their First Holy Communion.

The sacrament of Penance is celebrated on Saturday from 3:00-4:30 p.m.

A Communal Penance Service is celebrated during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

The Sacrament of the Sick

The sacrament of the Sick is available anytime upon request. It is intended for those who are facing serious physical or mental illness, surgery, or the declining effects of aging. A communal service of the sacrament is celebrated on the First Friday of each month at the 11:00 a.m. Mass. Holy Communion is taken to the sick and home-bound upon request. St. Catherine Laboure Church attends to the Catholics in the local care facilities

The Sacrament of Matrimony

A period of at least nine months is required for marriage preparation. Scheduling the wedding date takes place after the initial meeting with the pastor. If there has been a previous marriage by either party, Catholic or not, a declaration of nullity must be sought through the Diocese of Lansing before the marriage can occur. Please call the office to inquire.

The Miraculous Medal Novena is prayed at 8:50 a.m. on Mondays.

Exposition and Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament takes place on the First Friday of the month at the end of the 11:00 a.m. Mass until Noon.

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

THIRTY YEARS OF PREISTHOOD

On August 31st I will mark the 30th anniversary of my ordination to the holy priesthood of Jesus Christ. I was ordained with Fr. William Wegher at St. Mary Cathedral in Lansing by the Most Reverend Kenneth J, Povish. Our ordination should have taken place in June, but due to the fact that Fr. Bill had attended seminary in Belgium he would not have enough time to get ready for a June date. It was a little strange for me because I had received my parish assignment at St. Joseph Church in St. Johns, Michigan, but I was not yet a priest. So for over 2 months the pastor had to secure priests to cover the Masses that I would eventually be cele-brating. St. Joseph Church was also responsible for the care of Holy Family Church in Ovid, which was 8 miles east of St. Johns.

What a joyous day and weekend it was for me, my family and friends. My parents gave me a beautiful dinner reception in Bay City, Michigan complete with a polka band. The next day I celebrated my first Mass at my home parish of St. Hyacinth, followed by a reception in the parish hall. The rest of the day we gathered with out of town guests at the rectory of a priest friend. Monday, which was Labor Day that year was the third day of festivities. I opened gifts and cards and the remaining out of town friends began to head home. The following Sunday, September 8th I celebrated a first Mass at St. Patrick Church in Brighton, where I had spent an internship year as a seminarian. That day happened to be my Dad's 60th birthday. The parish gave me a very beautiful dinner reception afterward. The following Sunday I celebrated my first Mass at St. Joseph Church in St. Johns and thus began my priestly life.

Over the past 30 years I have served in the following parishes as a parochial vicar: St. Joseph, St. Johns, St. Mary Cathedral, Lansing, and Church of the Holy Family, Grand Blanc. As a pastor I have served at Holy Spirit Church, Hamburg, St. Joseph Church, St. Johns, St. Mary Church, Manchester, and St. Catherine Laboure Church, Concord.

St. John Vianney, the patron of parish priests, said the following about the priesthood: "Were we to realize fully what a priest is on earth, we would die: not of fright, but of love. Without the priest, the passion and death of our Lord would be of no avail....What use would be a house filled with gold, were there no one to open its door?" The priest is the only one who has the power to open the heavens and command that the Holy Spirit make present the great sacrament of the altar. He has been given this sacred power not for his glorification but for the salvation of God's people. He has also been given the sacred power to absolve sins in the sacrament of Penance. These are the sacred gifts that have been bestowed on him through priestly ordination. If we are lacking priests, it is our own fault. It reflects a lack of faith. Seeking worldly solutions to this spiritual problem, such as ordaining married men or women, just continues to show a lack of faith. We must beg God for priests and we must grow in faith and pass that faith unto our children.

On this happy occasion I ask for your prayers. I pray that Jesus, whose priesthood I have been chosen to share in, will continue to shower an abundance of priestly grace upon me and allow me to remain his faith disciple until death.
