Hopefully our prayer includes more "us, our and we" instead of "me and mine".

After all, it is called the "OUR Father".



Engaged? Are You Starting to Plan Your Wedding? Terrific! The Church is excited to assist you in preparing for your lifelong commitment! Some quick points to be aware of:

- Marriage preparation usually begins *at least six months prior* to a desired wedding date.
- No dates are scheduled until the couple meets with the pastor and fills out the necessary documents for marriage.
- If one or both have been in a previous marriage regardless of denomination or marriage by a justice of the peace, a Decree of Nullity (Annulment) will need to be obtained.

The best thing to do is contact the Church as soon as you are engaged so that we can help you right from the start!
