Salt for the Week



If God is loving, then why does evil exist?

This week's reading from the Book of Job (Job 7:1-4, 6-7) might well describe our feelings and thoughts over the past year! In many ways, life seems a struggle without much

confirmation that things will change anytime soon. What's a Christian to do? The presence of sickness and evil are described in two of our three readings and provide us an opportunity to look at our own thoughts about life and faith and the world. At times we might even think—"what's the use?"

For Job, the struggles in life were a time to deepen his roots of faith and to look for meaning and not just answers to the question "Why?" We turn to Scripture for guidance and consolation in the midst of the uncertainties of life. For all we can ever really count on is Jesus Christ.

For Further Reflection

1. Reacquaint yourself with the story of Job (Job 1:1-22, 2:1-13). Can you relate to Job? Why/why not? What did it feel like on your "Job" days?
2. The second reading (1 Cor 9:16-19, 22-23) recounts St. Paul's burning desire to preach the Good News, even if it wasn't accepted. Have you ever tried to spread the Good News by encouraging someone to do the right thing or turn themselves around? How did it go? What was the response? What are the challenges of being a prophet, a preacher of the Good News?
3. In the gospel account (Mk 1:29-39) Jesus spent Himself healing and driving out demons, and then went off to a deserted place so He could pray. When your life is hectic or you are consuming yourself for family or friends or work, do you remember to "go off to a deserted place," to get away so that you can pray and recharge? What gets in the way? How can you be more attentive to this important part of your spiritual life? Might this be a goal for the upcoming season of Lent?

"HOW COME?" Questions on How We Worship!

HOW COME WE GENUFLECT WHEN WE COME INTO CHURCH?

It's about reverence! While we are not the only faith tradition to have some kind of special "lamp" or "light" in the sanctuary, the history really comes from the Roman Catholics. In every Catholic church we have reserved the Blessed Sacrament—in which we believe that Christ is really present "body, blood, soul and divinity." Taken from Jesus' words at the Last Supper "This is My Body" and "This is My Blood," we believe that, as long as the bread remains uncorrupted, the sacramental presence of Christ remains. The consecrated Hosts are reserved in the tabernacle, (The Jewish Holy of Holies) which harkens back to the Old Testament Ark of the Covenant, a sacred place of the presence of God. The Blessed Sacrament is reserved in all Roman Catholic churches, and we instinctively look for the red sanctuary lamp which signifies Christ's sacramental presence. The only days of the year that the tabernacle is empty and the light extinguished are Holy Thursday and Good Friday. **Genuflecting** on our right knee towards the tabernacle is a respectful sign of reverence for the sacramental presence of Christ in our house of worship.

As you might guess, Ann ended up with the task of taking the dog for a walk—every day, every morning, and every night, at dawn and at dusk.

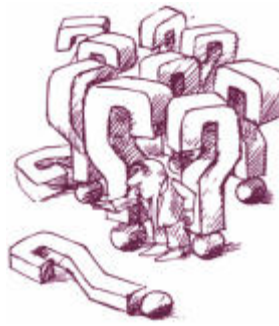
She resented the role at first. However, Ann soon discovered that it gave her a quiet time twice each day for peaceful reflection and silent prayer.

At the time of Vatican Council II, there was a period of little additions to the way Mass was celebrated. We used to name everyone who was doing anything in the Mass—servers, readers, cantors, greeters, etc. There also was a trend for announcements before the Mass started. Instead, now we focus on making spiritual preparation. Many folks, especially families, have lots of distractions getting everyone ready to come to church. We strive to have some quiet time or some reflective music to help make the transition. Some parishes have a rosary led before Mass, but even that should be completed at least five minutes before Mass begins. Announcements now are properly placed after the Post-Communion prayer, but before the final blessing...hoping that you will remember them as you leave!
