Salt for the Weak



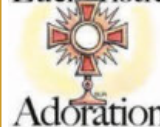
Easter, Ascension, Holy Trinity and the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, are all behind us in the liturgical calendar, and it is (as it were) "business as usual," or Ordinary Time. What exactly does this mean? The seasons of "Ordinary Time" in the church calendar, are much more than switching to green vestments and appointments in Church, and maybe less singing. As the saying goes, "There is nothing Ordinary about Ordinary time!" We would be hard-pressed to live in perpetual Christmas, or Lent, or even Easter... that kind of energy and excitement is hard to maintain. Rather, we live most of our lives "ordinarily," within our daily and weekly routines. But do not confuse ordinary with boring! The Christian life is a constant call to conversion of heart and the living out of faith, hope and charity. And within that is the underlying challenge of "keeping the main thing the main thing." What is that? The main thing is Jesus Christ. Keeping Christ foremost is a challenge each and every day—many times choosing between goods which can seem to blur the lines in making daily decisions. The Scripture lessons for the 13th Sunday of Ordinary Time illustrate scenarios where one even needs to choose between family or friends and being committed to the Kingdom of God.

If that sounds monumental—it can be, at times! But most days, it is the ordinary daily decisions we make that either keep Jesus close or keep Him at bay.

We take to heart the words of an old gospel hymn: "One day at a time, sweet Jesus!"

Eucharistic Adoration at the Emmaus

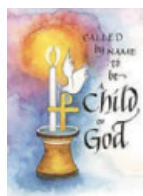


Pastorate—Since summer schedules are often interrupted, we will pause Adoration with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament until September.
