
The Emmaus Pastorate

Salt for the Weak

The themes of light and darkness figure prominently in the scriptures and they are themes with which we are very familiar. Besides "night" and

"day," we experience darkness during illness, death, or broken relationships. We see light in the good times, the future of children and grandchildren, weddings, accomplishments and of course. love.

But spiritually, have we "Seen the light?" This weekend's celebration of the Epiphany is full of references to darkness and light, about the light that is the "glory of the Lord." The light that is "enlightenment," making known the mysteries of God's revelation in Jesus Christ.

This is captured visually in the account of the magi:

"We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." (Mt 2:3)

So the reflection questions we ponder in this new year are...

- 1. Have we (do we) raised our eyes, our inner vision, to behold Christ the Light of the world? Or is it easier on our sight to avoid the light, the honesty, the truth which His light brings into our lives?
- 2. Are we afraid of the light? What might the light of Christ reveal about the way we live? Do I prefer darkness because it seems easier, less challenging, more familiar, even if I am unhappy or uncomfortable?
- 3. Once we get a glimpse of the light, do we allow our lives to change? The magi went home "by another way" (Mt 2:12) because their lives were changed by what they learned.

Our Emmaus Pastorate is named for a special journey of faith. This journey continues until the day we die. We walk along with Jesus in our doubts and fears, our disappointments, and yes, in our darkness. And all along the way, Christ is there, accepting, listening, challenging and loving us forward to the place He has prepared for each of us. And like the famous motel proprietor, he promises, "I'll leave the light on for ya."

It's there. All we need to do is look up. Happy and Blessed 2023...

Special Prayers for Pope Benedict XVI will be observed for NINE DAYS at each of our parishes, beginning January 5 through January 14, 2023.

These universal observances will include:

- Tolling of the church bells to call the Catholic Faithful to prayer
- Pray the Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be
- Pray the Holy Rosary before Mass
- Celebrate Holy Mass

In the Emmaus Pastorate, we will observe them by:

- Tolling bells before the parish Mass (if they have them)
- Please lead public Rosary for Pope emeritus Benedict before each Mass
- We will pray the Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be, after Holy Communion for the peaceful repose of his soul.

Divine Civil Disobedience—I am struck by the lengths the Magi went to in order to fulfill a divine mission. By cunningly avoiding Herod's duplicitous request to know where the young child was located, the three Magi likely saved the life of Jesus and in doing so, risked their own lives. Instead of traveling back to their homelands along a path that would inevitably have led them directly to the eagerly awaiting Herod, who was expecting their return, they decided to take a different route home.

Herod, the Roman client king of Judea, was well known during this time for his ruthless appetite for domination and violence. In deciding to follow the stirrings from God that emerged in their dreams rather than the directive of this power-hungry ruler, the Magi knowingly engaged in an act of divinely inspired disobedience. The courageous and bold decision to willingly disobey Herod's request provided Mary and Joseph with time to hastily embark with their newborn child on the long and arduous journey to Egypt.

The story of Epiphany and the courage of the Magi convey a certain theological truth: We are each called by God to be co-creators in the building of the reign of God here on earth. In a world in which laws are most often created and interpreted by the wealthy and powerful, the path toward creating a radically transformed society most certainly requires dissent

and nonviolent civil disobedience toward systems of domination, violence and greed. It is a path that demands we resist all that is antithetical to God's vision of love and liberation.


In reflecting on this past year I see many, many blessings in and through our ministry in our Pastorate parishes. While we are all still on the rebound from the COVID-19 challenges, I see a new normal emerging. Attendance has been wonderful and new families have joined throughout the year. Your willingness to share time and talent, as well as your treasure, continues to grow. Staff is always

encouraged to "broaden the base," that is, invite more people into active participation in the myriad of offerings and services that make up our ministry. Two months ago. I called attention to over 70 different opportunities offered throughout the Pastorate for prayer and adult education, not counting Faith Formation classes or the regular worship schedule! These things don't just "happen" but are part of a concerted effort of parishioners who have ownership of their faith and their commitment to their parish as well as the larger Pastorate. No doubt, God blesses these sacrifices!

We have just completed a wonderful observance of Advent. Worship is the optimum time we have to interact, form and teach. Untold behind-the-scene hours are spent in planning, rehearsing and executing of all these experiences. I am deeply grateful to our Director of Music and Liturgy, the individual parish Liturgy Coordinators, Faith Formation Coordinators, Adult Education leaders and our Deacon for their invaluable assistance. Maybe these are things we take for granted! Often we get communications from visitors, those viewing Mass online or on the radio, from the Wednesday mid-week checkins and the like, telling us how thankful they are to be able to experience Church in the Emmaus Pastorate. I might add that they are generous in expressing their gratitude financially as well!

As we look forward to a new calendar year, I offer these suggestions as you chart your course for 2023:

- Whatever your current habit, increase your daily prayer. If it's little to none, start. If you do from time to time, get regular. If you have a pattern, strengthen and lengthen it.
- The same holds true for worship. If you've been coming to Mass occasionally, increase your frequency. If you are pretty good about weekend worship, consider Mass during the week as a way to "tide you over" for the weekend. Read and prepare the Scripture readings that are listed in the bulletin. They will come alive much better if the weekend is not the first time you've heard them.
- What is your level of parish participation outside of worship? "Don't just GO to church, BE Church" means just that: In what other ways am I active? There are many ways to be involved- not sure



but always calls us to a new and more abundant life. The Church is the way we come together as sinners, seekers and believers, so that we can experience the grace of God in and through the Church and the Sacraments, as well as each other. Faith is our life. The New Year, strive to make it a more central part of yours. That's why we're here, and we're here to help.





The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has called for Eucharistic a Eucharistic Revival over the next three years, but many Catholics aren't aware that the revival also includes the Eastern Catholic Churches within the United States. The purpose of the revival, launched June 19, is to "renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy

Eucharist. The initiative ends in July 2024 with the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis.
