Please have 10-15 minutes of music prepared for prelude as a way to welcome our guests and set the tone of the celebration. Pieces on Communion and Easter are the obvious picks for today. You might consider either rendition of In the Breaking of the Bread for today too.

Watch for the Sprinkling Rite today; it'll come just after the Opening Song and will be followed immediately by the Gloria. Use as much of River of Glory as needed, but try to time the ending well for logistical reasons.

You'll notice a return of Mass of Spirit and Grace and Psalm 118: This Is the Day by Michael Joncas every week. Since it's Eastertide, let us repeat the Amen since Fr. Manalo has given us the option! You should also recognize the rest of today's music selections. Our offertory song was also used on Easter Sunday, so it should be familiar in every parish to some degree.

As always, please remember to rehearse before Sunday Mass, even the music you know well. And please continue to share with me your prelude, dismissal of children, and postlude selections so I can track and report what we're all using. Thank you!
