Commitment Weekend *Update*

Reporting back to you on last weekend's **Forward with Faith Campaign In-pew Commitment Weekend**, I first want to express my thanks for your support of our efforts—and your financial generosity—to make this campaign a success. I am more than confident that both our outreach program and also our end results will be successful as we seek to spread Christ's Word.

At all the Masses last weekend I went into detail about the our three-pronged approach to our program:

1. Reaching out to those in their 20s and 30s who have given up on faith in the Church or who feel the Church has given up on them;
2. Helping our established and practicing Catholic families to deepen and broaden their faith both in knowledge and in practice; and,
3. Helping our senior Catholics, whose faith or spirituality might be challenged in new ways due loss, ill health or loneliness.

Here is where we stand as of today: The amount raised—in-pew last weekend was \$143,452 from 74 parish families, an average gift of \$1,938.54! That's amazing!

To date, we have raised more than \$664,382.44 from 270 parish households out of our parish goal of \$590,000. And we have one leadership gift of \$200,000 to add to that overall figure making our total \$864,382.44. Now that we are passed our goal, we retain 80% of all monies raised going forth. Prior to the goal of \$590,000 we kept 50%, with the remaining 50% going into four (4) project funds within The Hartford Bishops' Foundation (**Vibrant Parishes, Champion of Service, Innovation and Technology, and Reigniting the Catholic Faith**) which every parish may apply to for support of local, parish projects for the future of our Archdiocesan Church family.

And what's equally amazing about the amount raised is that it came from just 13% of all our parish families. While I am hoping for a larger participation level by the end of our campaign, and knowing not everyone is able to give and that a sacrificial gift is different for each family—not knowing personal circumstances—it is my hope as we close out this fundraising effort that as many St. Catherine of Siena Parishioners will want to give something—\$50, \$100 or whatever—to make our work more successful. If you have not already contributed to our efforts, please drop your pledge form off at the parish office or in the collection basket at Mass.

We are at a crossroads in the Church and we need to do our utmost to bring the faith, hope and love of God to as many people as possible. While we do not need to travel to Africa or even Europe, we all are still called to evangelize the Truth of Christ and our missionary work happens to be right here, right now in our own families and communities.

From the bottom of my heart, I want to thank each and every person who made a donation or are offering prayers for our success. Not only does this say a great deal about who you are as disciples, but also reaffirms to me that as a parish we are on the right path to lead folks back to faith. Thank you! And to those still considering or praying over making a decision and a gift, may God lead you to what is His Will. Blessings to all and my sincere thanks to everyone who has offered—and will continue—to offer their prayers for Christ and His Church.

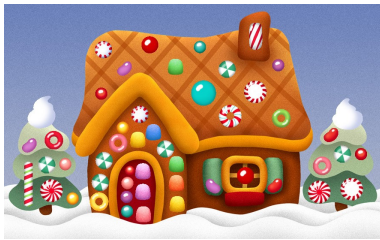
