All Souls', All Saint's Days

All Saints' Day is November 1. This year. According to the Collect, the opening prayer, of the Mass, we hear "Almighty and ever-living God by whose gift we venerate in one celebration the merits of all the Saints, bestow on us, we pray, through the prayers of so many intercessors, an abundance of the reconciliation with You for which we earnestly long. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and resigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen." In this short prayer, we acknowledge our belief in the power of the faithful Saints—their prayers and their lives to be emulated by us—whom the Church has recognized as being in the presence of God, so that this great company of witnesses will inspire us how to live and act as we journey on our own road to Emmaus.

All Souls' Day is November 2. On this is the day we celebrate Mass for the noble souls of the faithfully departed, as the Church calls us to pray unceasingly for those who have died, that they shall be welcomed into the glory of God's Eternal Life. Our opening prayer for Mass, the Collect, states: "Listen kindly, O Lord, and as our faith in Your Son, raised from the dead, is deepened, so may our hope in resurrection for Your departed servants also find new strength. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen."

We will hold a ceremony on Sunday, November 5th at the 11 am Mass where will honor all those who have died in our parish and whose funeral Masses we celebrated. At the end of the homily during the 11 am Mass, we shall read from the Book of the Dead, which comprises all the names of those we have prayed for and celebrated with a Christian funeral Mass. The Book of the Dead, inscribed with their names, shall rest upon the altar as their names read aloud complete with the tolling of the bells and incensation of the Book of the Dead. We pray for them and their family left behind, all of whom have been invited to attend that Mass, or if they are from afar, they may watch on livestream.

For our family and friends who have died and were not buried from our parish, their names may be placed on the envelopes in your packets—or on envelopes found at the entrances of the Church, and will be placed in a basket before the altar. All November, I shall pray for them at each and every Mass, and in my morning and evening prayers, required by my vows, I will mention them personally for the entire month of November.

Our purpose is to hold them in prayer, pray for their immortal souls, and assist them in being purified before God Himself.

Key Catholic Numbers

Some interesting Catholic-specific statistics from CARA, the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate, at Georgetown University illustrates the impact of fading Catholic influence in the United States. In addition, it calls us to a greater need for a "new and improved" mode of communicating the eternal-life saving messages of the Church.

- Since 1970, Catholic weddings in the U.S. have dropped by 69%, going from 426,309 in 1970 to 98,354 in 2020. At a recent wedding anniversary Mass at Hartford's St. Joseph Cathedral, which used to be full at this event, it was only half filled. And the total number of years represented by the married couples normally equalled 10,000 this past weekend it only added up to 3,000 years;
- Belief in Spiritual Entities (God, angels, heaven, hell and the devil), are also in decline. The most recent survey, May 2023, found that since 2001 the levels of belief in the following are: God, 90 to 74 percent; angels, 79 to 69 percent; heaven, 83 to 67 percent; hell, 71 to 59 percent; and, the devil, 68 to 58 percent;
- Some "good news," when a Catholic child is raised by two Catholic parents nearly 81% of the children identified as Catholic. However, when one parent was Protestant and one was Catholic, only 38 percent of the children identified as Catholic;
- In 1965 there were 58,632 total priests in the U.S., both Diocesan and Religious, in 2022 the total number of Catholic priests is 34,344;

- Total Catholic population in 1965 was 45.6 million, in 2020 the number increased to 66.5 million; that's 193,629 Catholics per priest;
- Total number of Catholic parishes in 1965 was 17,637, and in 2022 it is 16,429; and,
- Worldwide Catholic population by role: Bishops (5,340); Priests (407,872); Permanent deacons (49,176); Religious brothers (49,774); Religious sisters (608,958); and, Catechists (2,877,652).
- Current total Catholic global population: 1,375,852,000

The above statistics point to the many—and sad—outcomes in our culture and American society today. Perhaps this is something we, as a Church, should also be praying for the healing of the divisions in marriages, the strengthen of families, and the hope of the excellence of love; a love that unites and bonds us as one—and One with Him who is, was and shall ever be. "What a wonderful world it would be…"

NOVEMBER STREET SANDWICH MINISTRY

Our November Street Sandwich Ministry collection will take place early in November due to the Thanksgiving holiday. Sandwiches are needed for Saturday, November 11th, Sunday, November 12th, and Monday, November 13th. Sandwiches can be dropped off Saturday and Monday mornings from 8-9:30 a.m., and Sunday from 9-6 p.m. on that weekend. A sign up quantity of 1 means 12 sandwiches, or 1 dozen. A sign up of 12 means 144 sandwiches.

Sandwiches of any kind are needed-sub rolls, bread, pita bread, wraps, filled with deli meats/ cheese of any kind, tuna salad, chicken salad, or any kind of protein such as PB&J.

Please NO CONDIMENTS OR LETTUCE.

Also, if making PB&J, please spread PB on both slices of bread and then put the jelly in between. This prevents the jelly from seeping into the bread.

Please deliver individually wrapped sandwiches (foil, baggies, or cellophane) to the kitchen using the outside kitchen entrance (near the garage/shed). If you are able to help make sandwiches, please use this sign up genius link: https://bit.ly/3SbfAKL
