What's it all about, Advent?

Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent (from, "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas. In 2023, Advent begins on Sunday, 3 December and the Season ends on Sunday, 24 December.

The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time AND to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. However, the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36). Like Lent, the liturgical color for Advent is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.

As we prepare for Christmas, the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* notes some differences to the Mass that should be observed during the season. For instance, the priest wears violet or purple during Advent, except for the Third Sunday of Advent (*Gaudete Sunday*) when rose may be worn (*GIRM*, no. 346). Aside from what the priest wears, other aesthetic changes in the Church can include a more modestly decorated altar, more somber music, and no flowers in the sanctuary.

The final days of Advent, from December 17 to December 24, we focus on our preparation for the celebrations of the Nativity of our Lord at Christmas. In particular, the "O" Antiphons are sung during this period and have been by the Church since at least the eighth century. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming of Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but of present ones as well.

Advent devotions including the Advent wreath, remind us of the meaning of the season. An Advent calendar can help you fully enter into the season with daily activity and prayer suggestions to prepare you spiritually for the birth of Jesus Christ. In addition, our parish, St. Catherine of Siena, produces an Advent Calendar of its own to help offer various musical, spiritual and hands-on service projects meant to draw us all deeper into the preparation of our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming and to celebrate fully and rightly the Christmas season. DECEMBER STREET SANDWICH MINISTRY

Our December Street Sandwich Ministry collection will take place the weekend of **December 16th**. **Sandwiches are needed for Saturday, December 16th**, **Sunday, December 17th**, and Monday, **December 18th**. PLEASE ONLY DELIVER **SANDWICHES ON THIS WEEKEND**.

Sandwiches can be dropped off Saturday and Monday mornings from 8-9:30 a.m., and Sunday from 9-6 p.m., on that weekend. A sign up quantity of 1 means 12 sandwiches, or 1 dozen.

A sign up of 12 means 144 sandwiches. Sandwiches of any kind are needed-sub rolls, bread, pita bread, wraps, filled with deli meats/ cheese of any kind, tuna salad, chicken salad, or any kind of protein such as PB&J. Please NO CONDIMENTS OR LETTUCE.

Also, if making PB&J, please spread PB on both slices of bread and then put the jelly in between. This provides extra protein and prevents the jelly from seeping into the bread.

Please deliver individually wrapped sandwiches (foil, baggies, or cellophane) to the kitchen using the outside kitchen entrance (near the garage/shed). If you are able to help make sandwiches, please use this sign up genius link: https://bit.ly/3MWSC75
