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The Story of Saint Francis of Assisi

St. Francis was born in the town of <u>Assisi</u> in 1181. His father, <u>Pietro</u>
Bernardone, was a wealthy cloth merchant who had a very disagreeable temper. St.
Francis was a careless and undisciplined young man who spent his time singing and going to parties. He wanted to be a <u>knight</u> and win renown in battle. But he was captured and put in prison. Jesus came to him in a dream and challenged him to choose to serve him, the true king, rather than earthly rulers. Francis' heart began to change, and he spent long hours in solitary prayer. He came to understand that he was to share the love of Christ with everyone he met. The next time he met a <u>leper</u> on the road, he went up and embraced him rather than run away in fear and disgust. He wondered what God wanted him to do with his life.

One day at Mass he heard the <u>Gospel</u> where Jesus tells his disciples to go preach without carrying any money or owning anything, he decided to follow Jesus' teaching and give away all he had. He also took some of his father's expensive cloth and his horse and sold them—he gave the money to a priest. His father took him to court and Francis renounced his inheritance and wealth. After giving his life to the Lord, he



heard Jesus speak from the <u>crucifix</u> in the church of St. Damian. Jesus asked him to <u>rebuild</u> his church, so Francis began repairing a little church that was falling apart.

Francis began to preach the Gospel in many different towns. some men wanted to join him, and they began to be called <u>Franciscans</u>. The Rule of the Order of Friars Minor (the Franciscans) was approved by Pope <u>Innocent</u> III in 1209. The members of his order would embrace total <u>poverty</u> and littleness and travel as preachers. Francis and his followers began to preach the Gospel in many countries, including <u>Morocco</u> and Egypt. After meeting with the Muslim ruler of the region, Francis' followers were given authority to care of the major churches in the <u>Holy Land</u>. The Franciscans are known as the caretakers of the devotion known as the <u>Stations</u> of the Cross.

Francis founded a women's order of nuns after <u>Clare</u> of Assisi wanted to join him. Francis was fearless before men and animals; he tamed a <u>wolf</u> that was terrorizing the town of Gubbio. He preached to <u>birds</u> in the countryside and had a pet lamb that he had rescued from the town butcher.



Francis was ordained as a <u>deacon</u>, but he never sought to be ordained as a priest. He began the tradition of the Christmas <u>Nativity</u> set in 1223. A couple of years before his death, Francis received the <u>stigmata</u> (the wounds of Christ) while praying in a cave on Mt. Alverno. He composed a prayer called the <u>Canticle</u> of the Sun toward the end of his life. Francis died at the age of 45 in the year 1226 and the <u>basilica</u> built in his honor is a major pilgrimage site to this day. Many people who go to Assisi remark that the spirit of peace and joy that Francis lived by can still be felt in his hometown.
