January Virtue - Respect

This month, the children are learning about the virtue of Respect. Please feel free to talk with your child, and reinforce the lessons of respect at home.

Remember from Last Week

DEFINITION OF RESPECT:

Speaking and acting according to our own and others' rights, status, and circumstances.

Respect falls under the Cardinal Virtue of Justice. Justice enables one to give to each, beginning with God, what is due to him. A disciple of Christ living the virtue of justice respects oneself as well as other people, recognizing the dignity of each person. This person is obedient, loyal, and respectful to those in authority.

RESPECT LOOKS LIKE:

- Only saying nice things about your siblings and classmates
- Not laughing at others
- Listening the first time and discontinuing an action when someone asks you to stop
- Kissing a crucifix
- Listening attentively to others

RESPECT SOUNDS LIKE:

- He is really good at...
- It is not nice to laugh at people.
- I will stop doing that.
- Silence

New This Week

SCRIPTURE PERTAINING TO IT: Acts 14: 8-18

In Lystra there was a man sitting who could not use his feet and had never walked, for he had been crippled from birth. He listened to Paul as he was speaking. And Paul, looking at him intently and seeing that he had faith to be healed, said in a loud voice, "Stand upright on your feet." And the man sprang up and began to walk. When the crowds saw what Paul had done, they shouted in the Lycaonian language, "The gods have come down to us in human form!" Barnabas they called Zeus, and Paul they called Hermes, because he was the chief speaker. The priest of Zeus, whose

temple was just outside the city, brought oxen and garlands to the gates; he and the crowds wanted to offer sacrifice. When the apostles Barnabas and Paul heard of it, they tore their clothes and rushed out into the crowd, shouting, "Friends, why are you doing this? We are mortals just like you, and we bring you good news, that you should turn from these worthless things to the living God, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and all that is in them. In past generations he allowed all the nations to follow their own ways; yet he has not left himself without a witness in doing good—giving you rains from heaven and fruitful seasons, and filling you with food and your hearts with joy." Even with these words, they scarcely restrained the crowds from offering sacrifice to them.
