

A Message from Fr. David and Fr. Mason:

This weekend we celebrate Easter. The conquering of sin and death is realized in the empty tomb. Let us run to the garden to witness this amazing miracle and, then return to our family and friends and proclaim the Good News!! There is so much fear, confusion, hatred, and suspicion these days, there is so much anxiety and depression ... "But GOD' ... has a plan for each one of us. His son Jesus has come into our world to free us from the slavery of sin, to untie the chains that hold us down.

As we rejoice with the Universal Church and Christians around the world, we ask for the grace to be truly renewed and transformed, to put to death the "old man", and through the power of the waters of baptism, let us walk as children of the light, exclaiming until He comes again, Hosannah in the Highest!

We want everyone to return to Mass, and to feel safe doing so. And I would like to thank everyone for your gracious cooperation with the COVID-19 regulations and protocols we are following:

- Masks are required to attend Mass.
- Please wash/sanitize your hands.
- Please respect each other's personal space
- Please don't leave anything in the pews as you leave.

At the Saturday 4pm and the Sunday 7am Masses every other pew on the right side of the church is blocked off, please reserve these pews for the people who feel they need more space and don't want to sit close to other people.

And a reminder for Holy Communion:

- Unless the extraordinary minister distributes to the side sections, everyone should proceed down the main aisle and approach the sanctuary from the center.
- And then beginning in the center, line up standing side-by-side around the sanctuary, standing as close to the bottom step as you can, and the priest, deacon, or minister will come to you. The process allows you time to remove your mask and still reverently receive the Blessed Sacrament without feeling rushed.
- Family groups may stand/kneel right next to each other. We should be able to fit 5-6 people at a time.
- After you receive and have replaced your mask, please return to your pew from the side aisle.

As soon as a spot is vacated the next person should *immediately* fill that spot.

If you desire to receive on the tongue, please line up on the left (east) side and the priest, or minister, will gladly distribute.

Due to health conditions/restrictions, some of our ministers will not be distributing on the tongue; they will distribute on the right (west) side.

Families may APPLY NOW for an Income-Based Scholarship for the 2021-22 school year

Dear Families,

We have great news. Families may now apply through Step Up for Students for an incomebased scholarship (either the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship or the Family Empowerment Scholarship) for the 2021-22 school year for students in K-12.

We have been asked to encourage all families interested in Catholic School, regardless of income bracket information, to apply as soon as possible. A bill is predicted to pass in the near future, that would have significant benefits to families who are currently in Catholic schools, which is why we are encouraging all families interested to apply.

 Upon review of a family's application and supporting documents, Step Up for Students will determine if the student qualifies for either the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship or the Family Empowerment Scholarship.

IMPORTANT: In order to assure timely processing for a full scholarship, Step Up needs to receive the <u>application and all required documents</u> by June 1, 2021. Step Up will continue to accept applications after June 1, but cannot assure those received after that date will be processed in time to receive a full award.
