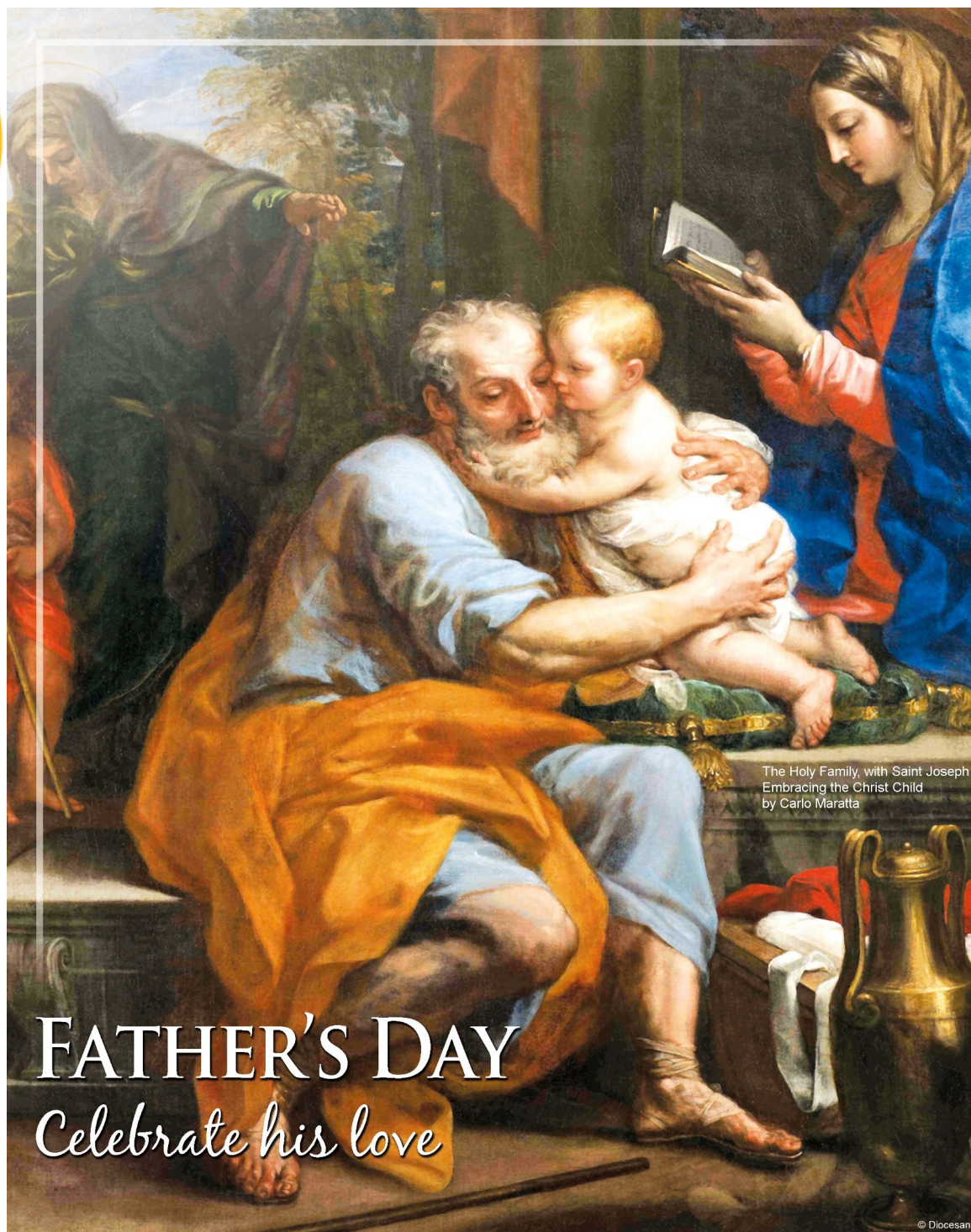

A Message from Fr. David and Fr. Mason:

Happy Father's Day! In his apostolic letter announcing the Year of St. Joseph, Pope Francis describes St. Joseph as a "beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows." St. Joseph, the Guardian of the Holy Family, is our model. We pray to St. Joseph to strengthen Catholic fathers for their mission to be sacrificial leaders, protectors and providers for their families. Let us be grateful to our fathers, by birth or by adoption, these unsung heroes, who love us and support us through life; to our priests and bishops, who act as spiritual fathers; to God our Father, who loves us and will always teach justly and grant us boundless mercy.

Our reading today is taken from the Gospel of Mark, the primary Gospel reading in Lectionary Cycle B. Mark presents a vivid portrait of Jesus, whose words and deeds show that he is the Son of God. The Gospel offers evidence of Jesus' power and authority as he calms the storm. In Jesus' time, power over nature was believed to be a sign of divinity — for only God calms storms. Jesus' rebuke of the storm also echoes the rebuke he uses when he talks to and expels demons. In each situation, Jesus' power and authority is a sign of his divinity. Indeed, the disciples are left wondering about Jesus' identity at the conclusion of today's Gospel, which is a recurring theme in Mark. They see before them a human being, a humble man, but also one who acts with the authority and power of God.

Thank you to everyone for your gracious and continued cooperation with the COVID-19 regulations and protocols. And please be mindful that not everyone is at the same comfort level, and many still need to take serious precautions for themselves and their loved ones.

Outreach to our friends in need. Do you know that we have a robust outreach ministry to help our friends and neighbors who are in need? If you are ever approached by someone before or after Mass asking for money, please direct them to the parish office so that we can get them the appropriate and adequate assistance.

Sacred Silence

We realize that some people are very happy to finally be out of lock-down and to be congregating with their friends and loved ones, and it's understandable that we want to talk and share. But we again humbly request that all non-essential conversations take place outside, and please use a whispered "inside voice" for those necessary and urgent conversations. The courtyards and the portico are excellent spots for catching up with friends.

Pope Francis had this to [say](#):
"Praying, as every true dialogue, is also knowing how to be in silence — in dialogues there are moments of silence — in silence together with Jesus. When we go to Mass, perhaps we arrive five minutes early and begin to chat with the person next to us. But this is not the moment for small talk; it is the moment of silence to prepare ourselves for the dialogue."

It is the moment for recollection within the heart, to prepare ourselves for the encounter with Jesus. Silence is so important!"

And it is a beautiful act of mercy and charity not to disrupt the quietude and prayerfulness that many people look forward to and have a right to experience when they visit the Church, arrive early before Mass, and/or stay after Mass to pray.

A few reminders:

- 1) The obligation is to attend the **entire Mass**, which begins with the entrance hymn/song and ends when the priest and other ministers recess out.
- 2) Please remember that the sign of peace should be exchanged only at the invitation of the priest or deacon.
- 3) Only Catholics who are in good standing, i.e., the state of grace, should receive Holy Communion: at minimum this means that you believe what the Church believes, you regularly practice the faith, you have received sacramental absolution for any serious sin, and if you are married, you are married according to the Church's norms.
- 4) Procedure for receiving Communion.
 - a) As you approach the sanctuary, please line up shoulder to shoulder around the front step and the minister will approach you one at a time. After you receive the Eucharist, please return to your pew down the side aisle. The next person in line should fill in the vacant spot immediately.
 - b) If you are seated in the side sections, and there is no extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, please wait until those in the center sections have received and then approach the sanctuary from the side aisle.
 - c) If you would like to receive kneeling and/or on the tongue, please come to left side of the sanctuary.

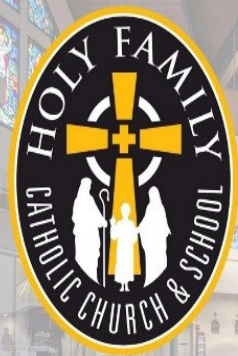
