Parish Information

A message from Fr. David:

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

As we approach the end of the Liturgical Year, the Church directs our attention to what is commonly called “**The Last 4 Things**”. These deserve our attention because of our tendency to be complacent in the face of what we can’t see and what we’d rather not think about. But we need to think about them because every one of us – without exception – will encounter the first two, usually when they are least expected. How we prepare ourselves for those encounters will determine our destination concerning the last two. “The Last 4 Things” are: Death, Judgement, Heaven, Hell.

Death. The final inescapable reality that we will all face in life is death. Most of us fear death because we dread its finality. But death is not the end; it is merely a transition to eternity. What kind of eternity depends on how we lived our lives: did we live in conformity with the teachings of Jesus or in opposition to them, which brings us to:

Judgement. When we die, we will be judged immediately by Jesus in what is known as “The Particular Judgement”. The big question will be: did we accept or reject Jesus? Jesus will judge us on our faith, our obedience, and our works. And that judgement only allows 2 eternal possibilities.

Heaven. This, obviously, is the desired possibility. In fact, this is our intended destination: this is what we are created for! The Catechism describes Heaven as “the ultimate end and fulfillment of the deepest human longings, the state of supreme, definitive happiness...with the Most Holy Trinity, the Virgin Mary, the angels and all the blessed.” Now, not all who die in God’s grace are immediately ready for entry into eternal beatitude. Some (many?) need to undergo a final purification to prepare them to enter the blessed state of Heaven. This purification is Purgatory. For those who do die outside of God’s grace or friendship, there is only one other possible end...

Hell. Hell is eternal separation from God. Ultimately, it is our own free choice; the result of the choices made during our lifetime on earth. God is a Gentleman: He kidnaps no one; He will not force anyone to spend eternity with Him against their will. Neither does God predestine anyone to Hell; He simply confirms our willful and persistent rejection of Him.

No (fill in the blank) November, have you decided what you are going to give up for the month of November to help get you (and your family) prepared for the Advent season.

On Tuesday, November 2nd, we will remember All of the Faithful Departed as we celebrate All Souls Day. Please note that the 9:00 am Mass will be pushed back until 9:15 am. And we will remember the souls of the unborn babies, and the consolation of the families, beginning with a rosary at 6:00 pm, followed by a blessing of the new Memorial Garden, and Mass at 7:00 pm.

In her mercy, the Church makes a plenary indulgence available throughout the entire month of November. ([Click here](#) for more information).

Applicable only to the souls in purgatory, to the faithful Catholics who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray for the departed, they are given an indulgence. ([Click here](#) for more information).

On Friday, Nov. 12 and Saturday, Nov. 13, we are excited to welcome Peter Herbeck and his daughter Rachel for a parish mission, focusing on living in the Holy Spirit in response to the “signs of the times” and how to live this out in the midst of our families. Both talks will begin at 7:00 pm. Saturday night will begin with a time of music and praise at 6:30 pm. Following the 9:00 am Mass Saturday morning, we will have break out sessions for men and women.

Health Information

First Aid Antiseptic: Walmart generously donated over 50 bottles of 70% Isopropyl Alcohol to us. If you would like a free bottle, please come by the Parish Office to pick one up.

Each day we are hearing of more and more people who are sick, some with the corona virus, others with respiratory complications, the flu, or other viruses. Please be considerate of each other and take precautions such as washing hands frequently and avoiding unnecessary touching (hugging and shaking hands). Everyone is free to wear a mask if you feel it necessary, and the Bishop expects anyone who is not vaccinated to wear a mask at Mass.

Also, please remember that when Bishop Estévez reinstated the obligation to attend Sunday Mass, he reminded us that one does not have an obligation to attend Mass on Sunday in the following circumstances:

1. You are ill, or your health condition would be significantly compromised if you were to contract an infectious illness (i.e., you have underlying conditions or are in a high-risk category).
2. You exhibit flu-like symptoms.
3. You have good reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness (e.g., you were in recent contact with someone who tested positive for a contagious illness such as COVID or influenza).
4. You care for the sick, homebound, or infirm.
5. You are pregnant.
6. Those 65 years of age or older (per the CDC's recommendation of high-risk individuals).
7. You cannot attend Mass through no fault of your own (e.g., no Mass is offered, you are infirm), or, while wanting to go, you are prevented for some reason you cannot control, (e.g., your ride did not show up, the church was at capacity).

Reminders for receiving Holy Communion

- ◇ As you approach the sanctuary, please line up shoulder to shoulder around the front step and the minister will approach you one at a time. After you receive the Eucharist, please return to your pew down the side aisle. The next person in line should fill in the vacant spot immediately.
- ◇ If you are seated in the side sections, and there is no extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, please wait until those in the center sections have received and then approach the sanctuary from the side aisle.

As we know **November 1st** is **All Saints Day**. Which is normally a holy day of obligation, but because of the way the calendar falls this year, it is NOT a holy day of obligation. On Monday Nov 1, we will have our regular Mass schedule: 7:00 am and 9:00 am. Tuesday **November 2nd** is **All Souls Day**, when we commemorate the souls of all the faithful departed. In addition to the 7:00 am and 9:00 am Mass, we will have a special Mass at 7:00 pm, in honor of all the souls of the babies who have died before they were born, by miscarriage or abortion. Please come out to pray for these babies as well as for the parents and families who mourn their loss.

Also in the month of November, we honor the memory of the departed through our **Book of Remembrance**, which is placed by the baptismal font throughout the month. In it are inscribed the names of all who had funerals at Holy Family Parish in recent years. We pray that the promise of their Baptism to share in Christ's Resurrection will be fulfilled so that they may join the saints in heaven.

Dear Holy Family School Community,

Each year, one of our top initiatives is improving the curriculum and facilities for all students of Holy Family.

With donations during the 2020-2021 school year, Holy Family raised over \$40,000 to upgrade classroom furniture for all preschool and kindergarten classrooms. We also updated our outdoor area with new picnic tables, shade umbrellas and landscaping. Several generous donors helped to secure new projectors for every classroom and new STEM program enhancements.

This year the golf tournament, which raised over \$11,000 in profits, the Black and Gold Gala, and the Spring carnival will fund two major projects: upgrading 1st and 2nd grade classrooms and converting the youth room into a state-of-the art STEM lab. These upgrades will cost an estimated \$100,000. The addition of a STEM lab will make Holy Family more competitive with other public, private, and diocesan schools that have one or more STEM labs and allow Holy Family to expose students to STEM facilities, tools, projects and learning processes to better prepare them for high school, college and beyond.


STEM is an acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. The integration of STEM in schools has been proven to increase a student's critical thinking skills, while preparing them for real life challenges, educational courses, and careers. Holy Family is fortunate to have a STEM program led by Mrs. Yanny Salom, a University of Notre Dame STEM Teaching Fellow. The STEM program will allow all grades K through 8th to have a hands-on experience with a dynamic, multi-discipline, service-learning approach that Mrs. Salom currently implements in middle school. Students will investigate, collaborate, design, create, and solve problems with the new tools the STEM lab provide.


Recently, several members of our school visited other schools with STEM labs to discern best practices and facility needs. The group has determined that Holy Family's lab will need:

- Robotics and coding equipment
- Hydroponic Garden
- 3- D Printing
- TeacherGeek STEM Maker Cart
- Area for embryology and butterfly habitat
- Flexible/collaborative seating, desks, and storage
- Interactive/touch-screen educational displays

Some minor construction will be necessary beginning the last day of the 2021-22 school year including converting the floors to a new non-slip surface, upgrading the lighting to dimmable LED lights, adding a door and window between the classroom and lab, upgrading internet capabilities, and adding drop down electrical to allow students to plug in from anywhere in the STEM lab.

To support our two projects this year, we encourage parents to plan on attending the Black and Gold Gala. Donors who unable to attend are welcome to donate and/or sponsor the funding of specific needs for the STEM program, which can be found on our website. Your contribution is an investment in the education of our students, your children, and future leaders.



