

Parish Information

A message from Fr. David:

We made it!! We have arrived at the final week of our liturgical year with this great celebration of Christ the King. And it is a fitting time to reflect on whether or not we have allowed Him to sit upon the thrones of our hearts, our bodies, and our families. The feast came about in response to the rise of communism and all of the lies that it brought concerning the human person, and the proper role of Christ in the lives of the Christians and in the public life of all. In our current time, we are seeing a growing influence of a competing narrative about our lives, about human sexuality, and about marriage and family life. We need to be reminded once again of the Truth taught to us by Jesus and His Church. We need to be encouraged to boldly proclaim Christ as King.

Pope Pius XI, with his encyclical *Quas primas* (Latin for First Things) established this great feast and here are a couple of pertinent paragraphs. I would encourage you all to read the entire document. <u>Link provided to the encyclical</u> in our Parish weekly email.

- 31. When we pay honor to the princely dignity of Christ, men will doubtless be reminded that the Church, founded by Christ as a perfect society, has a natural and inalienable right to perfect freedom and immunity from the power of the state; and that in fulfilling the task committed to her by God of teaching, ruling, and guiding to eternal bliss those who belong to the kingdom of Christ, she cannot be subject to any external power.
- 33. The faithful, moreover, by meditating upon these truths, will gain much strength and courage, enabling them to form their lives after the true Christian ideal. If to Christ our Lord is given all power in heaven and on earth; if all men, purchased by his precious blood, are by a new right subjected to his dominion; if this power embraces all men, it must be clear that not one of our faculties is exempt from his empire. He must reign in our minds, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. He must reign in our wills, which should obey the laws and precepts of God. He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things, and cleave to him alone. He must reign in our bodies and in our members, which should serve as instruments for the interior sanctification of our souls.

Last weekend we had an incredible encounter with the Holy Spirit as Peter Herbeck and his daughter Rachel preached to us about the powerful reality of our lives as disciples living in the world today. I wish more of our parish family would have taken the time to attend the talks. Those of you who attended the 9:00 am Mass on Sunday were able to get a little taste of their powerful preaching as Peter spoke to us at the end of the Mass. 
