

CATHOLIC CULTURE CORNER

There is a devotion this time of year that not too many people participate in, for various reasons. For one, it is not very well known. For another, even when it is known, it doesn't have the same prestige or glamour that other devotions have. To some, it could seem macabre. I'm speaking of the devotion of visiting a cemetery.

Obviously visiting a cemetery is a common enough occurrence. We usually do so to remember a particular person, most often in association with a particular date. But we don't think of it as a "devotion." However, many of the greatest Catholic devotions can be found in the Church's book of indulgences (*Enchiridion Indulgentiarum*), which is where we find this one. The indulgences of the Church are really an attempt to breathe new devotional life into the Body of Christ.

One of those indulgences requires a visit to a cemetery during the first eight days of November. Starting with All Saints' (Nov. 1) and All Souls' Day (Nov. 2), this month we traditionally remember the dead in a special way. The Church is convinced that it is good that we expend the energy and go out of our way to pray for the dead and visit them at the cemetery, even if we do not know anyone buried there. I would argue, in fact, that is an even greater act when we do not know someone there. Of course, we'd rather practice our prayers and devotions in our homes or in a beautiful church, but it can be a greater act of love to do so outside on a cold Fall day.

A plenary (complete) indulgence can be obtained on behalf of the dead for each of these eight days by visiting a cemetery and praying for the souls in Purgatory, along with the other usual conditions (prayers for the Pope's intentions, sacramental confession, Communion on the day of the visit, and the big one - detachment from all sin). To learn more about the Church's teaching on indulgences, I encourage you to read the letter Pope St. Paul VI's letter, "*Indulgentiarum Doctrina*." It is short, yet it sheds a lot of light on a Catholic doctrine that is often unnoticed or misunderstood. —Fr. Oiland-
