Congratulations on Your Ordination as Auxiliary Bishop



"You Are The Christ, The Son of The Living God" (Mt 16:16)

Homily of the Holy Father Leo XIV

I invite you to recognize the marvels that the Lord has done in our lives and the blessings that the Lord continues to pour out on all of us through the ministry of the Church. Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God, the one Savior Who alone reveals the face of the Father. In Him, the Father revealed Himself to us in the trusting eyes of a child, in the lively mind of a young person, in the mature features of a man, and in a Glorious Body after the Resurrection. God thus showed us a model of human holiness that we can all imitate. In Christ, we received the gift of God and the path to follow in order to be changed by that Gift.

The salvation of the world is entrusted to the Church, to us, who were chosen by God and sent forth to proclaim the Gospel. We are the Church called to illuminate the darkness of this world through our own holiness. The Gospel speaks of two worlds. The world that at first considers Jesus an insignificant person. However, once His requirements for moral honesty become irksome, this "world" does not hesitate to reject and eliminate Him. Then there is the world of ordinary people. For them, Jesus is an upright man, one who has courage, who speaks well, and says the right things. They follow Him, but in times of danger, during His Passion, they too abandon Him.

What is striking about these two attitudes is their relevance today. They embody notions easily found on the lips of many men and women in our own world. Today, there are many settings in which Christian faith is considered absurd, meant for the weak and unintelligent. Settings, where technology, money, success, power, or pleasure are preferred. These are contexts where it is not easy to preach the Gospel and bear witness to its Truth, where believers are mocked, opposed, despised, or at best tolerated. Yet, precisely for this reason, those are the places where our missionary outreach is desperately needed.

A lack of faith is often tragically accompanied by the loss of meaning in life, the neglect of mercy, the violations of human dignity, the crisis of families, and so many other wounds that afflict our society. Today too, there are many settings in which Jesus, although appreciated as a man, is reduced to a kind of charismatic leader or a superman. This is true not only among non-believers but also among many baptized Christians, who end up living in a state of practical atheism. This is the world that has been entrusted to us, a world in which we are called to bear witness to our faith in Jesus the Savior, to make ourselves small so that He may be known and glorified, to spend ourselves to the utmost so that others may have the opportunity to know and love Him.
