

Some apples may be ready for picking. The figs, pomegranates, and avocados are still growing, not quite ready yet.



"The Parable of the Good Samaritan" (Luke 10:25-37

Homily of Pope Leo XIV

This beautiful parable constantly challenges us to think about our own lives. It troubles our dormant or distracted conscience, and warns us about the risk of a complacent faith that is satisfied with the outward observance of the Law, but incapable of feeling and acting with the same merciful compassion as God. This parable speaks about compassion that moves the Samaritan to act, after a Priest and a Levite walked by the wounded man lying on the roadside, "the Samaritan saw him and had compassion on him" (v 33).

It counts how we see others, because it shows what is in our hearts. There is a kind of seeing that is superficial, hasty, distracted while pretending not to see. Then, there is a seeing with the eyes of the heart, looking more closely with empathy that is allowing us to be touched and challenged. The good Samaritan is a figure of Jesus who is seeing us with compassion and does not walk by. We too, in our own day, must confront the darkness of evil, suffering, poverty, and the riddle of death. Jesus came to heal our wounds and pour out upon us the balm of His Love and Mercy.

This parable is challenging for each one of us. Christ showed us the face of a compassionate God, then to believe in Him and to be His disciple, means allowing ourselves to be changed and learning to have a heart that is moved, eyes that see without looking away, to have hands that help others, and shoulders that bear the burden of those in need. Once we realize that Christ, the good Samaritan, loves us and cares for us, we too will be moved to love and care for others in the same way, we too become witnesses of His Love and His compassion in our world. Today, we need a "revolution of love" that was expressed on the road to Jericho. Today, roads are traveled by those who descend into sin, are suffering, and experiencing the pain of poverty. Today, roads are travelled by all who hit rock bottom, are robbed by tyrannical systems, and are victims of wars that killed their dreams and their very lives. What do we do? Do we look and walk by or do we open our hearts to others, like the Samaritan? Are we content to merely do our duty and regard only our own group of like-minded people as our neighbor? Jesus shows us the example of the Samaritan and He is asking us to "go and do likewise" (v 37).
