BLESSED ARE THOSE WHO HAVE NOT LOST HOPE (Sir 14:2)

Message of Pope Leo XIV for the Grandparents and the Elderly.

The Jubilee of Hope, which is celebrated this year, helps us to realize that hope is a constant source of joy, regardless of our age, and it is the source of intense happiness late in life. Sacred Scripture offers many examples of women and men whom the Lord called late in life to take part in His Plan of Salvation. Abraham and Sarah were advanced in years when God promised them a child. Their childlessness prevented them from any hope for the future. When Zechariah received the news of John the Baptist's birth, he reacted with surprise: "How can this be? I am an old man and my wife is advanced in years" (Lk 1:18). Whenever we think of the impossible, the Lord surprises us with an act of saving power.

God repeatedly demonstrates His providential care by turning to people in their later years. This was the case not only with Abraham, Sarah, Zechariah, and Elizabet, but also with Moses, who was called to set his people free when he was eighty years old (Ex 7:7). God thus teaches us that old age is a time of Blessing, and the elderly are the witnesses of hope. The physical weakness of their bodies allows them to manifest the strength of God's action. The number of elderly people is increasing, and this is a sign of the times that we are called to discern. The life of the Church and the world can only be understood in the light of the passage of generations. Life is more than the present moment and should not be wasted in superficial encounters and fleeting relationships.

Pope Francis wrote during his last hospitalization: "Our bodies are weak, but even so, nothing can prevent us from loving, praying, giving ourselves, being there for one another, in faith, as shining signs of hope" (16 March, 2025). Our freedom to love and pray cannot be taken away by difficulties. Everyone, always, can love and pray. This sign of living love reminds us that "even if our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day" (2Cor 4:16). We are called to create networks of support for the elderly, prayer for them and with them, and forging relationships that would restore hope and dignity to those who feel forgotten. Let us press forward in confidence in our Lord, be renewed each day by our encounter with Him, and pass on the faith we have lived for so many years.
