# SAINT THOMAS AQUINAS PARISH The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) 2025-2026

The Christian Initiation of Adults is a process developed for non-Catholic adults who desire to join the Catholic Church, and Catholic adults who desire to complete the reception of the Sacraments of Christian Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist. It is a journey of faith marked by study, prayers, and Liturgical Rites leading to the encounter with Jesus Christ and full communion with the Catholic Church. The length of this journey is different for each person. However, there are standard periods of preparation marked by celebrations of Rites:

- I. **Period of Precatechumenate** weekly sessions of evangelization, a period of initial conversion, a time to develop a genuine will to follow Christ and to seek the Sacraments of Initiation.
- II. *The Rite of Entrance into Catechumenate* manifests the will of the Inquirers to enter the Church and the Church receives them. The handing on of the Cross of Christ marks this entrance.
- III. The Period of the Catechumenate is a time of catechetical instructions, leading to the intimate knowledge of Christ and the Mystery of Salvation, a time of prayer and participation in the Liturgical celebrations.
- IV. **The Rite of Election or Enrolment of Names** is celebrated within the Mass of the first Sunday of Lent. The Catechumens are "elected" to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. They write their names in the *Book of the Elect*.
- V. The Period of Purification and Enlightenment of the Elect a time of Lent, a period of self-examination, interior reflection, catechetical instructions, prayers, and celebration of Scrutinies.

The Rites of Scrutinies are celebrated during the third, the fourth and the fifth Sunday of Lent. The Scrutinies are set forth to purify hearts and minds of the Elect and awaken in them the will to cling more closely to Christ.

*The handing on of the Creed* takes place following the First Scrutiny.

The handing on of the Lord's Prayer takes place following the Third Scrutiny.

- VI. Celebration of the Sacraments of Christian Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist the final step by which the Elect are made members of the Church. This celebration takes place on the Holy Night of the Easter Vigil.
  - **Baptism** this Sacrament gives the Baptized persons a new life of Sanctifying Grace by which they are made members of the People of God.
  - **Confirmation** follows Baptism, indicating the unity of the Paschal Mystery, the connection between the Mission of the Son and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.
  - **Eucharist** the newly Baptized, now raised to the ranks of the Royal Priesthood, receive the Eucharist for the first time.

- VII. The Period of Mystagogy is the final period of Christian Initiation of the newly Baptized. It is a time of reflection and understanding of the Sacraments received.
- VIII. The Pentecost Sunday closes the Period of Mystagogy.
