#### "The Parable of the Good Samaritan" (Lk 10:29-37)

Catechesis of the Holy Father Leo XIV

The setting of this parable is a difficult and impervious road, just like life itself. It is a road travelled by a man going down from Jerusalem, the city on the mountain, to Jericho, the city below sea level. The man is attacked, beaten, robbed, and left half dead. This experience happens when situations, people, sometimes even those we have trusted, take everything from us and leave us in the middle of the road.

Our life is made up of encounters, and through those encounters we emerge for who we really are. We find ourselves in front of others, faced with their fragility, weaknesses, and it is up to us to decide what to do: to take care of them or to pretend nothing is wrong. A Priest and a Levite travel the same road. Both serve in the Temple and yet, their practice of worship does not lead to being compassionate. Compassion is not a religious matter but a question of humanity. We are called to be human before being believers.

We can imagine that, after staying a long time in Jerusalem, the Priest and the Levite are in a hurry to return to their homes. It is indeed the haste, so present in our lives, that often prevents us from acts of compassion. Those who think that their own journey must take precedence are not willing to stop for another. But the Samaritan, a person belonging to the despised people, simply stops when seeing another man in need of help.

Compassion is expressed through practical gestures and direct contact. The Samaritan binds the wounds of the injured man, loads him onto his horse, takes him to the Inn, and pays for his care. When we, too, will be capable of interrupting our own journey for a gesture of compassion? Only when we understand that the wounded man in the street represents each one of us, and only when we remember the times that Jesus stopped to care for us. Let us pray that we can grow in humanity, so that our relationships may be truer and richer in compassion. Jesus is our model of true humanity and compassion.




