## **STB Readies for Its Next 100 Years**

I am pleased to have the opportunity to introduce the new, independent St. Bernard's High School on behalf of its Board of Trustees. As most of you are aware, St. Bernard's is one of the many Catholic schools impacted by declining enrollment due to economic challenges and other factors. This past summer, the Diocese of Worcester announced the 2019-2020 school year would be the last year it would financially support St. Bernard's. The Diocese has firmly and publicly agreed to support the launch of St. Bernard's as an Independent Catholic High School beginning on July 1, 2020.

A group of dedicated alumni, parents and staff came together to begin transitioning STB to this independent governance model. Tremendous work has been done over the past months to move this project forward. In November, a strong new Board of Trustees was established. My fellow board members include: Kathy Krysiak '90; William McSheehy '66; Gregory Moran P'98 '01 '03; Karen Pelletier '80; Nicholas Pelletier '05; Vincent Pusateri II; Dr. Bernard Westerling P'89, '91, '93 and '96; John Zarrella '78; Rev. Joseph Dolan and Sr. Mary Nacarrato, PBVM.

There is a strong need for a successful St. Bernard's in the region. There is no other Catholic high school alternative in our area. Local public schools may not offer a suitable fit for students who want a personal, holistic education based in faith with a strong track record in college preparation and placement. Our classes are admittedly too small, but our students are still performing at a high level. We have a new leadership team - Linda Anderson, Principal; Deb Maloney, Admissions Director, and Heather (Weibel) Tullio '88, College Counselor, who all have high energy and expertise. With the right resources and support from the Board, they are capable of rapidly growing STB's programs and enrollment.

Affordability is a clear challenge for many in the area. The board reduced tuition and committed to support scholarships and aid for all deserving students who want to attend STB. STB's greatest potential asset is you: a very deep and successful alumni base which we recognize needs to be re-engaged and re-energized. Please do not hesitate to reach out if you have questions or believe that you can assist the effort.

We researched a number of independent Catholic school case studies on the East Coast and interviewed headmasters who have successfully grown their schools through similar circumstances. We have confidence with your help that we can build a great school with a strong foundation for generations to come. Based on our fundraising efforts, enrollment progress, community support, and the recent blessing of Bishop McManus, we have great confidence STB will succeed. By securing a strong capital base to invest in programs, we are able to make a renewed commitment to providing a first-rate college preparatory education for our students. With broad alumni support, the school can overcome the challenges it has faced recently and we can secure the future of STB for generations to come.



# From the Principal's Desk

2019 was an exciting year at St. Bernard's and we are eager to share our updates with the alumni community!

Despite our small size, we are able to offer a wide variety of courses and extracurricular activities.

In academics, we have introduced several new electives to prompt student interest and enrich their traditional college-prep load. Music Appreciation, Law, Philosophy, Marketing and Communications, and independent studies in Web Design and Photography round out our standard offerings, including our much beloved Latin program and many AP offerings.

Critical thinking and communication have become the singular focus of our Humanities Department, while project-based learning and subject fluency dominate our Math-Sciences. Additionally, plans are underway for continued advancements to next year's curriculum, including the introduction of college and career-prep concentration tracks in Health Sciences, Engineering, and Business, and the initiation of junior year internship capstones.

In athletics, our golf team made the districts and our football team won its second Super Bowl championship! The boys competed at Gillette Stadium and were featured across local media outlets including a front page nod in the Boston Herald and on Channel 5 WCVB News as Mike Lynch's "High School High Five". They will soon be awarded their championship rings to commemorate this fantastic run.

In faith and service, STB continues its one-hundred year tradition of helping the poor in Fitchburg and surrounding towns. Our student-led "Saints Against Hunger" event served up the one-millionth meal for the United Way of Northern Worcester County and were featured on WBZ News with Michelle Fisher. Students are continually engaged in monthly service projects, hosted by Campus Ministry and the Theology Department, to help understand the true message of Nano Nagle and The Sisters of the Presentation: "Not words, but deeds."

In the arts, STB begins a new tradition of celebrating the many diverse cultures represented in our community through art residencies. Starting in February with Black History Month, we will welcome the African Arts in Education Program for a school-wide workshop on African drumming, followed by a concert in traditional African music that's open to the public. March and St. Patrick's Day bring us an Irish cultural exposé, featuring performances by Irish step dancers and a foot-stomping, show-stopping Celtic concert. Additionally, the arts department saw the creation of new clubs (Acapella, Art Club) to help further introduce our students to the benefits of creative expression, while the Drama Program plans its first musical production in years.

Life is good af STB, and the student body, faculty, and staff bring a renewed energy to the community. We are eager to see that energy continue to build and flourish as we make way for a new beginning as an independent Catholic school!



STB Back to Back Superbowl Champions



With a roster of twenty eight players this season, St. Bernard's returned to the "House that Brady Built" at Gillette Stadium for back to back state championships. In the Division 8 Superbowl, STB beat the undefeated West Bridgewater Wildcats 30-8. West Bridgewater, who shut out seven teams only allowing 60 points in their regular season, was no match for our Bernardians who took to the ground with 287 yards rushing and never looked back.

In the 2018 victory, STB beat Pope John High School winning 46-35. Pope John High, like West Bridgewater, was also undefeated coming into the game. The 2018 win marked the school's first championship since 1997 and was the second highest scoring game in MIAA bowl history.

Congratulations to Coach Tom Bingham celebrating his twenty fourth year at the helm, his staff, and our STB players! A three-peat is in the works for 2020! GO STB!
