## **School Updates and Highlights**

#### Five Years & Beyond: Refining Our Strategic Plan and Showing Gratitude for the Journey So Far

On January 30th, 2024 we celebrated 4 years since the day the Diocese of Worcester gave St. Bernard's High School the greenlight to continue on as an important educational option for students in Central MA and Southern NH! While receiving the greenlight was critical, it was only the beginning of a challenging journey. We needed to successfully execute a five year strategic plan focused on growth and sustainability!

These last few years have been amazing, but not without challenges. Soon after our journey began, the Pandemic brought unprecedented challenges to the operations of a school. Our facilities and grounds needed extensive work to modernize and rejuvenate. Our strategic and operational leadership needed to pivot to begin to address critical community engagement, fundraising, and thoughtful governance. And, most essentially, our enrollment needed to grow.

What has been accomplished in four short years should be celebrated. Our enrollment has doubled to over 200. Academically, our students are thriving as shown in their outcomes. We've expanded academic and extracurricular programming. Our athletic teams are flourishing. Our faculty is comprised of dedicated and inspirational professionals. Our alumni community is re-engaging and lending much-needed expertise, support, and enthusiasm.

As we continue on this journey, inevitably nothing stays static. As many of you are aware, Principal Linda Anderson will be stepping down at the end of this academic year after five years as principal. We are blessed to have had Principal Anderson serve as our guiding light. Her contributions to the regrowth, stabilization, academic advancement, and nurturing of a culture of faith and support have been invaluable.





## Welcome Incoming Principal Joseph Cussen

After an nationwide search, the school is thrilled to announce that this summer we will welcome our 20th principal, Mr. Joseph Cussen.

A native of Arlington, MA, and a graduate of Boston College High School, Mr. Cussen comes to us with a wealth of experience and a deep commitment to our Catholic values and educational mission. His passion for fostering academic excellence and nurturing a supportive learning environment aligns perfectly with our school's ethos, and we are confident that he will lead with integrity and dedication.

Mr. Cussen holds multiple advanced degrees. These include a Master of Arts, Educational Leadership from the University of Notre Dame; a Master of Education, Curriculum & Instruction from the University of Massachusetts; a Master of Theological Studies, Boston College; and a Bachelor of Arts, Theology & Philosophy from the University of Notre Dame.

He has been Director of Campus Ministry and Chair of the Theology Department at Bishop Blanchet High School in Seattle WA since 2019. He spent nearly 10 years at Bellarmine College Preparatory School in San Jose, CA in various teaching and administrative positions.

When asked why he is eager about his new role as Principal, Mr. Cussen responded, "I believe that Catholic education is special because we can educate the whole person. We can educate student's hearts, minds, and souls and that's the gift that Catholic education brings." We are thrilled to welcome Joe back home to Massachusetts and into our Bernardian Community.

#### **Faculty & Staff Spotlight: Paul Constantino**

To highlight the current community members that make St. Bernard's High School shine, we are eager to feature one of our unique and gifted Bernardians in each newsletter. This issue's featured Bernardian is Theology Department Head, Boys Varsity Basketball Coach, and Assistant Football Coach, Mr. Paul Constantino.

An alumnus of St. John's High School and Assumption College, Mr. Constantino blends scholarly acumen with real world Catholicism into his classes. Mr. Constantino has served the STB community for eight years after retiring as a case worker and counselor with the Massachusetts Department of Corrections. As a proud Bernardian parent to Michael '15, Erin '16, and Maggie '21, and the spouse of an alumna, Mrs. Michelle McManus Constantino '81, Paul Constantino made the deliberate choice to dedicate his talents to the STB community following in the legacy of his own grammar school teachers — the Sisters of the Presentation. And we are grateful for that legacy, because few teachers have the daily, lasting impact that "Coach Connie" has on our students.

Blending the humanistic, service-based tradition of Maryknoll, where he served as a seminarian in his youth, with his decades of experience as a counselor, case worker, teacher, and coach, "Mr. C" has become a vital, elemental part of the Bernardian community. His unique perspective and teaching style — traditional in its Socratic roots and emphasis on essay writing — have challenged, inspired, and guided students for years. That's because in Room 402, students explore the real life contexts in which faith, hope, and love are inevitably called to abide; they are challenged to think deeply, compassionately, and authentically about life's great mystery and beauty — something often missing in 21st century curriculum.

Not only a favorite in the classroom, Mr. C is just as beloved on the court and field. His Hall of Fame winning coaching has drawn student athletes to his leadership for decades, and this year, he's poised to yet again inspire dozens of student athletes on the coach's bench of both Boys Varsity Basketball and Varsity Football.

#### **Bernardian Family Spotlight: The Calamares**

Chances are that if you are reading this newsletter you probably know one or more of the Calamare Family. The family is on its fourth generation of Bernardians.

Cara's husband Bill does announcing at football and basketball games and did not go to STB, but feels the connection and understands and loves the family and generational ties.

Leo's great grandchildren are or will be students at the high school. You will see Charlotte Dunbar and Emily Terho thriving on the fields and academically. In 2025 year two more Dunbars will join the freshman class keeping this legacy going.

When asked how she felt about her grandchildren continuing the StB tradition, Roberta Arsenault cited the quality, size, and culture of the school as huge positives. Today's students benefit from an atmosphere that is "safe, familiar, and promotes faith-based values."

## Do You Remember the Chicken Coops?



Alumni from the late 1930's to the mid 1960's do! The chicken coops were a temporary solution to accommodate the remarkable growth of the high school until permanent facilities could be planned, funded, and built. The topic of the coops was mentioned by many, many alums in attendance at our November luncheon.

Sentinel articles from 1938 and 1939 document the the first two of the portable buildings. When all was said and done, a total of eight portables would be erected to the right of the main building. Students would travel to the main building for assembly and lunch. Alumni recall there being some benefit to the chicken coops - such as spending freshman year apart from upperclassmen. Alumni, however, also remember them being more than a bit chilly in the winter!

By June 1963, four portables had been removed as work commenced on the new addition. By 1965, construction on the school enlargement was finished and the portables became fond memories for decades of Bernardians.

#### Corinne (Audet) Prunier '42 Turns 100

The Alumni Office received the news from Corinne that she turned 100 on Christmas Day. Corinne, is the sister of fellow alumni Charlie Audet '36 and Raymond Audet '44. She is cousin to Roger Hachey '48.

Corinne is blessed not only with remarkable genes, but also with a wonderful family and full life. Upon graduation, Corinne attended St. Vincent's nursing school. During this time, she joined the more than 100,000 American women served their country as members of the United States Cadet Nurse Corps. Corinne was one of forty cadets assigned to a hospital in New Jersey that cared for soldiers who needed mental health assistance as they returned from war. Eight out of ten Audet siblings served their country at some point in their life.

Corinne married J. Edward L. Prunier, a psychiatrist, veteran, and educator who passed in 2005. The couple was blessed with 5 children, 12 grandchildren, and 11 great grandchildren. (Number 12 is on the way too!)

When asked about her life, Corinne quickly points to how fortunate she and her siblings were to have parents who created a positive environment even in the face of difficulty. In addition to their genes (both parents lived into their mid-90's), the Audet siblings inherited strong faith, positivity, and the need to stay engaged and productive.

St. Bernard's evokes feelings of thankfulness from Corinne. She admires the Sisters, cherishes the education she received from them, and recalls wonderful times with her best friends Irene (Babineau) Quintal and Irene (Fournier) Reardon. Her first comment during this interview, however, was an adamant one. Corrine wants all readers to know that **even at 100 years-old, she is still a Bernardian at heart and hope others feel the same way!**
