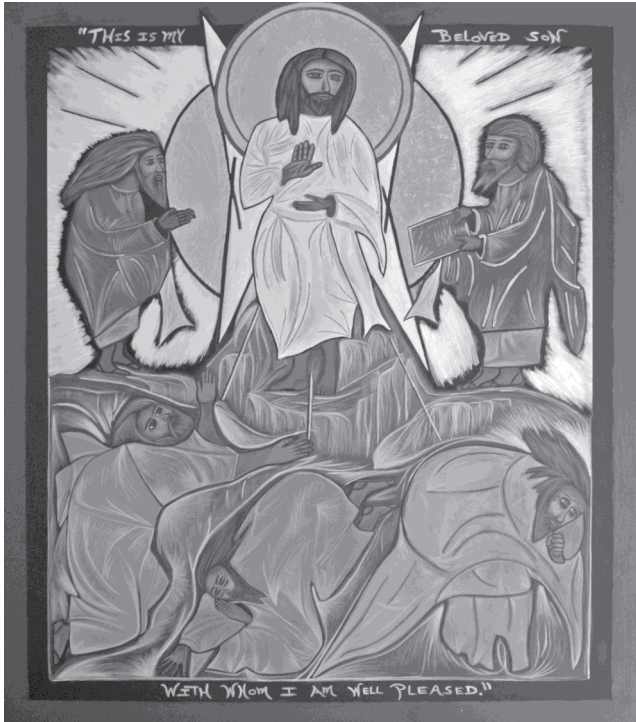


Transfiguration Parish

From the Desk of Deacon Chris...**DON'T BELIEVE THE BIGGEST LIE –
HOLINESS IS POSSIBLE!**

Matthew Kelly is an author whose books I read quite often. I enjoy reading his books because he makes excellent points which cause me to think about my life as a disciple of Jesus. Kelly writes in a simple, common sense manner, and I don't need a dictionary by my side to understand the words he uses.

The most recent book I just completed is titled, "The Biggest Lie in the History of Christianity" and sub-titled, "How Modern Culture is Robbing Billions of People of Happiness." The title caught my attention right away, and I wanted to find out just what is that biggest lie that Kelly refers to. The answer is both troublesome, and, I suspect, largely true. Kelly suggests that the biggest lie that modern culture would have us all believe is that holiness is not possible. Kelly asks us to search our hearts and ask ourselves this question. Do I believe holiness is possible for me? I think many people would answer that they believe holiness is possible for saintly people or special Christians, but probably not possible for themselves.

Kelly writes that nothing could be further from the truth. Not only is holiness possible for each of us, holiness is what God intends for us! We are all called by God to be saints, and our mission is to spread the Gospel of Christ throughout the world. I certainly understand how Kelly states that culture and modern society is robbing us of the happiness of holiness, but I believe it goes even deeper than just culture and society. I suggest the source of the lie that makes us think that holiness is not possible is Satan himself. Yes, we know that Jesus conquered Satan once and for all by his passion, death, and resurrection. That does not mean that Satan has gone away. Yes, through Christ we all have the power to resist Satan and all his temptations, but that does not mean Satan has given up. Satan likes nothing better than for us to believe holiness is not possible.

Let's say we all believe holiness is possible for us. The next question is how do we go about becoming holy? Matthew Kelly says the answer is in Holy Moments, and he defines a Holy Moment as this, "A Holy Moment is a moment when you open yourself to God. You make yourself available to him. You set aside what you feel like doing in that moment, and you set aside self-interest, and for one moment you simply do what you prayerfully believe God is calling you to do in that moment. That is a Holy Moment."

By the grace of God, I believe we can all create Holy Moments. And here is the good news. Holy Moments are like a snowball rolling down a hill. As it rolls, it becomes larger and larger just like Holy Moments can increase more and more. My friends, let's not believe the biggest lie in the history of Christianity. Holiness is possible! Believe it! God bless.

Nurses' Notes:

Health Tips: *Lights out! Keep your bedroom dark for better health. It's a high-tech, hyper-connected world out there. Whether you're a constant Tweeter, a proud Luddite, or something in between, it's important to remember that your body's basic needs are decidedly low-tech. Case in point: Preliminary research shows that nighttime light exposure, known to affect sleep rhythms, may also affect your risk of insulin resistance, a condition that can precede diabetes. In a small study, researchers had one group of young adults sleep in darkness, while others slept with an overhead light on. Those who slept with a light on for a single night had higher insulin levels the next day. More research is needed to determine how chronic light exposure at night may affect insulin levels. But there's evidence that the blue light from cell phones, tablets, and laptops can disrupt circadian rhythm and sleep, and some research links light exposure at night to an increased risk of cancer, obesity, learning issues, and depression. If you tend to burn the midnight oil, use social media or TV as a lullaby, or simply fall asleep with the lights on, come on over to the dark side. Give your brain the darkness and downtime it needs by dimming the lights or using only red wavelength light between 7 PM and 7 AM. You can also facilitate your sleep by powering down your devices at least an hour before you turn in and turning off the lights both in and outside your room at bedtime. If a streetlight's glow spills into your bedroom, invest in a comfortable sleep mask or light-blocking shades. Supporting your body's natural rhythms means being unafraid of the dark, embracing it. <http://www.clevelandclinicwellness.com>*

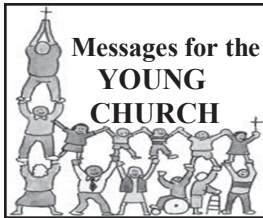
