St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians that we are many parts, but one body in Christ. Reminder: Blood Pressure screening next week. Stop by before or after Mass throughout the weekend to have your blood pressure checked.

Health Tips: Water is life — and brain food. But don't forget plenty of water! You need it for your body's basic functioning and your brain power. According to new research, you don't have to run a marathon or get lost in a desert to experience the effects of dehydration, including impaired thinking ability. Researchers found that getting dehydrated affects our ability to perform tasks that require paying attention, and it can happen faster than you might think. For example, doing vigorous yardwork for a few hours without drinking can lead to acute dehydration, which can make it difficult to focus, drive, and complete tasks that require attention, coordination, or problem-solving. So how much water is enough? There's no set amount for everyone. It depends on your weight, activity level, and the weather. The best way to gauge your level of hydration is the pee test: If your urine is clear or light yellow, that's a good sign you're drinking enough. Bear in mind that alcoholic beverages can dehydrate the body (sorry!). Keep in mind that you need extra liquid in warm weather, and on days spent exercising or being otherwise active, it's a good idea to "pre-hydrate" with a couple glasses of water an hour or two before the activity. Keep drinking while you're active, and have more when you're done. Water is your best bet for staying hydrated, but if you're doing intense exercise for an extended period of time, a sports drink can help you recoup the sodium and potassium you lose through sweat, along with the fluid. http:// www.clevelandclinicwellness.co
