*From the Desk of Deacon Chris...***LISTEN TO THE ONES WHO LOVE US**

The title of this week's article is just as much for me as it is for any of you. Let me tell you why this is so. I typically take Fridays off every week, unless there is a funeral or some important parish event that I need to be involved with. Anyway, this story begins on Wednesday evening. Patricia went out to the kitchen for something, and when she turned on the light switch for the overhead lights, the bulbs blew in one of the fixtures. Now, that does not seem to be any big deal, but Patricia and I both know that God did not bless me with skills to fix things or put things together. Even changing a light bulb can be a challenge for me.

Patricia knows me better than I know myself. Right away, she told me not to try to change the bulbs without her there. I can almost reach the overhead light from the floor, but I do need a small step stool to get to it. I know Patricia loves me, and is concerned that I might fall and get hurt, so she told me to wait to change the bulbs when she is home.

Friday came, and I found myself all alone in the rectory. You can probably guess what I did. I decided to change those light bulbs on my own. Looking back, I was reminded of the Genesis story of Adam and Eve. God the Father loved Adam and Eve, and told them they could eat any of the fruit in the garden except from the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden. Of course, we know that Satan, appearing as a serpent, tricked Eve into eating from the tree. Now, I am not saying Satan tricked me into changing the light bulbs. I did not see any serpents in the kitchen. My point is Adam and Eve did not listen to God the Father who loved them, and I did not listen to Patricia who loves me.

The story does not end well. I had no problem unscrewing the glass cover from the fixture, but as I was stepping off the step stool I fumbled the cover. It was like everything was suspended in time, as I watched in anguish as the glass cover floated in the air and crashed onto the kitchen floor! Certainly part of my penance for not listening to Patricia was spending the next hour cleaning up pieces of shattered glass from the kitchen floor.

Might the glass cover still have shattered even if Patricia had been there? Possibly, but we will never know because I chose not to listen to the person who loves me, just like Adam and Eve chose not to listen to God the Father. Isn't it true that we sometimes think we have all the answers, that we can do it all on our own, that we do not need anyone's help? Then, after we mess everything up, we realize we were wrong, and we ask the one who loves us for their forgiveness.


NOTICE!!!
