From the Desk of Deacon Chris...

WONDER AND AWE TOGETHER WITH JOY

Bishop Emeritus Howard Hubbard joined us at Transfiguration Parish on May 22, 2019 to confer upon sixteen of our parishioners the Sacrament of Confirmation. Being relatively new to the Diocese of Albany, I have not heard Bishop Hubbard's homilies that often. I must say I was very impressed with what I heard that evening. The Bishop spoke directly to the Confirmandi, but I dare say his words resonated with everyone in the church that night.

Bishop Hubbard told us that we should never lose the wonder and awe of God! Just stop and think about that for a moment. How often do you consider and appreciate the wonder and awe of God? As I ask myself that question, I realize that I do not appreciate the wonder and awe of God nearly enough. Maybe that is because I live with the wonder and awe of God at all times in every situation of my life. Yes, there are moments that are so amazing and magnificent that I become very aware of the wonder and awe of God, but most of the time I just go on with my life without stopping to appreciate the actions of God in my life.

I wrote recently about my brother Mike's stroke, and at the end of the article I asked everyone to pray for his recovery. I want to report to you that Mike is now home, and is nearly back to full health. Believe me when I tell you that my brother's recovery has been nothing short of miraculous. Even the doctors are surprised at how well Mike is doing. Talk about the wonder and awe of God, and the power of prayer! Yes, my brother received exceptional care at Albany Medical Center and Sunnyview Rehab, but I will always be convinced that his recovery went way beyond his medical care. I am so grateful to Father Ingemie who came to the hospital to give my brother the Sacrament of Anointing, which is a Sacrament of Healing and Peace. I am sure in my heart that it was our prayers, and the healing power of Jesus that brings me to a place of wonder and awe, and reminds me that anything is possible for God. Thank you all for your prayers.

Nurses' Note:

Blood Pressure Screening THIS weekend. Stop in and have your blood pressure checked read by a Registered Nurse
Health Tips: Get fit now to protect your brain later! Ladies, start your engines. Your internal engine, that is, the one that propels you to walk, run, dance, bike, play tennis, kick around a soccer ball — or whatever type of exercise you most enjoy doing. Putting in your exercise time now is a fantastic investment in long-term good health from head to toe. And speaking of heads, new research adds to the evidence on the brain-protective power of exercise. In a long-term study, a group of nearly 200 middle-aged women took an exercise test that measured their peak cardiovascular capacity and were rated as having a high, medium, or low level of fitness. They then received periodic evaluations for dementia over several decades. Over the course of 44 years, only 5 percent of the highly fit women developed dementia, whereas 25 percent of moderately fit women and 30 percent of those with a low fitness level did. In other words, the most fit women were nearly 90 percent less likely to get dementia than the least fit women. This study didn't prove that exercise helps to prevent dementia, but it's one of many showing a strong link. Carve out a half-hour for cardio a day, most days of the week, and work in a few weekly strength-training sessions.
