From the Desk of Deacon Chris...

CHRISTIAN HOSPITALITY: ALL ARE WELCOME

We often refer to our church buildings as, "The House of God." Every week in the House of God, we celebrate Holy Eucharist as we give honor and glory to God in Word and Sacrament. We rejoice as we receive the living Body and Blood of Jesus Christ in Holy Communion, and we all come together as a community of faith. But do we all come together?

We can all think of times we have travelled on vacation, and attended Mass in another parish. How were you welcomed? Did you feel you were entering a Christian community that welcomes strangers with warm hospitality? Or, did you feel like you were not particularly welcome at all, that you were looked upon as an outsider? I have experienced both situations over the years. I have attended Masses in parishes whose people welcomed me as one of their own. They smile and say hello, or welcome you as you enter the church. They might hand you a prayer book or a bulletin, and let you know where the restrooms are. might even let you know they are having a hospitality hour after Mass, and invite you to join them. At the sign of peace, they make a point of wishing you the peace of Christ, and you wish them the same. You leave Mass feeling like you were a welcome participant in the Eucharist, and you thank God for such a gracefilled experience in a parish that is not your parish.

I have also experienced situations where the reactions and attitudes of the parishioners were anything but welcoming. Maybe you know what I am talking about. You enter the church, and can almost feel a negative vibe. It is almost like people are saying to you, "What are you doing here?" People may look at you, but it is with more of a glare than a smile. People certainly do not say hello, or welcome you to their parish. Tell me if this has ever happened to you. God help you if you inadvertently sit in someone's seat! They will tell you in no uncertain terms that you need to move because you are in their seat. It may seem like you are attending Mass in a hostile environment.

Along the same lines, giving to others, whether that means giving your money, your time, or lending an ear to someone who needs it, fuels happiness. A healthy lifestyle, with plenty of exercise and enough sleep, can help you manage stress and feel good. 
