The Psalms: A School of Prayer

Joy to you! Our Adult Faith Formation prayer study on *Lectio Divina* continues to be an inspiring and deep religious experience for those who are able to attend.

In our prayer we have been looking at the psalms which are found in the Old Testament. They are not only the prayer book of Israel under the Old Covenant, but they also play a central role in the prayer life of the New Covenant. Did you know that there are 150 psalms in the bible and many were written by King David? The psalms include prayers of adoration, praise and thanksgiving, contrition, lament and even desolation. So, no matter what your are feeling, there's a psalm that captures that emotion.

Every Mass includes a reading (often sung) from the psalms. This Responsorial Psalm invites us to respond in prayer to what we hear in the first reading.

Psalm 139 below is a beautiful psalm to reflect upon. The words help us to know who we truly are as beloved children of God. This week I invite you to pray over one of the three sections of the psalm below. Pray it as a love letter from God. Daily prayers,

Psalm 139 vs.1-6

Sister Rose

"O Lord, you have searched me and known me! You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from afar. You search out my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways. Even before a word is on my tongue, beholding, O Lord, you know it altogether. You beset me behind and before, and lay your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is high, I cannot attain it."

Psalm 139 vs. 7-12

"Where can I go from your Spirit? Or where shall I flee from your presence? If I ascend to heaven, you are there! If I take the wings of the morning and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, even there your hand shall lead me, and right hand shall hold me. If I say, "let only darkness cover me, and the light about me be night, even the darkness is not dark to you, the night is bright as the day; for darkness is as light with you."

Psalm 139 vs. 13-18

"For you formed my inward parts, you knitted me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am wondrously made. Wonderful are your works! You know me right well; my frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately wrought in the depths of the earth. Your eyes beheld my unformed substance; in your book were written, every one of them, the days that were formed for me, when as yet there was none of them. How precious to me are your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them: If I would count them, they are more than the sand. When I awake, I am still with you."
