Dear Friends - a Reflection on Death and the Resurrection

What comes after death? Our response to this question about death often reflects both how we view life and how we view eternity.

As a young boy I was first confronted with death when my grandfather died. I remember what it was like to see my father shed tears for the first time, the day his father died. My dad was a New York City policeman and my grandfather a lieutenant with the NYPD. Growing up, I often looked at old photos of my grandfather in his uniform, so big and strong. When he died, he was frail and could hardly walk. I remember wondering if there was a correct way to act or what kind of feelings I should have at this time.

Somewhere along the path of life I was taught the foolishness of Wisdom 3:23:

> "They seemed, in the view of the foolish, to be dead; and their passing away was thought an affliction, and their going forth from us, utter destruction.'

I had picked up the comfortless belief that death was meaningless, and that my demeanor should reflect the sadness of grief.

Years later, God would call me, not to law enforcement, but to the priesthood to preach the Good News - the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Like most priests, I have been confronted with death and dying almost every day of my priesthood. But God has a funny way of turning things around. When I was younger, or before 'taking my faith seriously,' death and funerals were always bleak and fearful moments. Now they are opportunities to speak about God's love and all that awaits those who "find favor with Him."

When my mother was dying, I experienced a 'graced moment' - a comforting assurance deep in my heart that I believe came from God. This moment came as I was standing with family members at my mother's bedside. I held her hand as she struggled to breathe. Old photos of my mom began to flash before my eyes; mom in her First

# Saint of the Week Blessed Maria Celeste Crostarosa September 11th

Blessed Maria Celeste Crostarosa was born in Naples, Italy, on October 31, 1696. Giulia, Celeste's baptismal name, was an intelligent, vivacious child, the tenth of twelve children. She was taught as a child to pray and love God with all her heart. At the age of six, she began to experience unusual intimacy with Jesus. She longed to serve Him all the days of her



life, which led her to the religious life as a Carmelite after persuading her mother to allow her to enter that monastery. After that monastery was dissolved, at the age of 27 she entered a monastery in Scala. While a novice, the Lord appeared to her during Holy Communion and dictated to her a New Rule for the Sisters that their lives would be a "Viva Memoria," a Living Memory of the work of salvation accomplished in the Paschal Mystery out of love for all humankind. This was met with incredulity by the community and she was called a troublemaker filled with illusions. Nevertheless, Sr. M. Celeste made her profession in 1730, and the approval for the New Rule was given in 1731 after a young priest and canon lawyer, Alphonsus Liguori, declared Celeste's visions authentic and the Rule inspired by the Lord. Later that year, she had another revelation in which she heard the words, "Go and preach to every creature that the Kingdom of God has come upon you." After sharing this with Fr. Alphonsus, he was encouraged to beginning the Congregation of the Redemptorists and in 1732, the Congregation was founded. Three years later, Celeste was expelled from the monastery, but after long, prayerful reflection, she could not follow imposed

Communion dress and veil, mom in her wedding gown, full of joy and happiness.

In my mom's bedroom there was a crucifix hanging on the wall above her head. As she struggled to breathe, I glanced at the crucifix. Jesus struggled to breathe as he hung upon the cross, and he suffered unimaginably for us. Jesus died for us, and three days later, he rose from the dead and brought us New Life - Everlasting Life.

As I looked down at my mom, gasping, tired and longing to be reunited with her loving husband, I thought - that's what it's all about! Our God loves us so much, - he took on our suffering and pain by going to the cross and dying for us and rising from the dead so that we could live forever! My mom's suffering and death deepened my faith - a 'graced moment.'

My mom breathed her last breath, and a smile came to my face. I was filled with joy that my mom would be with my dad again and with all the angels and saints but most importantly with God who created her and to be with Him forever in heaven.

My friends, let us remember we are all called to be saints, we are all called to holiness. We look forward to be reunited with our dear loved ones who have passed, if we remain faithful to him who loved us first.

"What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love Him," God bless, Father John

dictates contrary to the inspirations revealed to her by her Savior. After helping reform a Dominican monastery, Celeste began her own monastery in 1738 in Foggia, putting into practice the New Rule of the Order of Redemptoristine Nuns. There, St. Alphonsus assigned the young Redemptorist Brother Gerard Majella to serving as the orders spiritual director. Thanks to the support of these two men, the monasteries grew even past Celeste's death. On September 14, 1755, Mother Celeste died on the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross at the age of 58. She enjoyed supernatural gifts during her life. The humiliations she bore only strengthened her conviction to follow more faithfully and generously in God's plan of love. To this day, Bl. Maria Celeste Crostarosa shines brightly as a foundress, a woman of prayer, a witness to liberty of conscience and mystic. She was declared a blessed on June 18, 2016, in Foggia, Italy.




#### PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS


