

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Gospel reading this week was my mom's least favorite Gospel passage. It is a story about two sisters, Martha and Mary, and the different ways that they respond to a surprise visit from Jesus. My mom disliked this reading because at first glance it seems to be saying that what Mary has decided to do, sit and talk with Jesus, is a better thing to do than what Martha decided to do, get up and serve Jesus. It is understandable that my mom wouldn't like this, because her life, like many of you, was spent doing countless hours of serving,

cooking, cleaning, laundry. It never stopped. She did it out of love. But this passage seems to be saying that it would have been better if she hadn't done all that work, but rather sat and prayed, let her kids go hungry and her house dirty. But, is that really what this passage is saying?

It sure seems so. Jesus even explicitly says that Mary has chosen "the better part" right? Actually, that isn't completely true. I know that I have told you this before, but it is worth hearing again. St. Luke didn't write the Gospel in English; he wrote it in Greek. In the original Greek, the story says not that Mary has chosen "the better part" but that she has chosen "a good part." There is no judgement between the two regarding what they have chosen to do in response to Jesus coming to their house. Mary has chosen well. Martha has chosen well too, because Jesus was probably hungry and thirsty after walking and preaching all day.

None the less, Jesus does give a gentle rebuke to Martha when she complains to him about Mary. Notice that Jesus doesn't say, "don't tell me that." Jesus is fine listening to our complaints. What Jesus rebukes Martha about is what she is focused on. She is focused on her frustration with Mary and her heart is divided because of this.

Last Saturday, the Knights of Columbus from St. Clare Parish hosted a nice cook out for the men of the parish and I gave a little talk and we had some good conversation. One of the things we talked about was holiness. I shared that one of my seminary professors had defined holiness this way; he said that holiness equals wholeness. That holiness means having an undivided heart and being who each of us was made to be. With this understanding in mind, what Jesus is challenging Martha about is the holiness of her actions. Jesus is not saying that serving, cooking, and being hospitable is unholy. On the contrary, these most certainly can be holy things to do. But Martha, although doing something good and holy, has allowed her heart to be divided by her anger that her sister is not helping her. Her holy actions are drowned out by her divided focus, her divided heart.

So, what does this mean for us? To me, it all comes down to holiness and wholeness. We know that it is good to sit quietly with the Lord. We know that it is good to serve others. In fact, we know that both of these are essential to living an authentic life as a follower of Jesus. What Jesus is encouraging us to do today, in whatever way that we are being present to Him, is to be undivided in our hearts, like Abraham in the First Reading, who was undivided in his care for his visitors. To be undivided in our focus on Christ, like St. Paul in the Second Reading.

Martha and Mary both chose to do good and necessary things. Martha just let her focus slip from Jesus to herself and her frustration with what her sister wasn't doing. Martha let that divide her heart. Be on guard against this in your life. It can make perfectly holy things become less so.

Raffle tickets have been mailed out to every registered household. Completed tickets can be returned to the office. Additional tickets will also be available if you can sell more!






