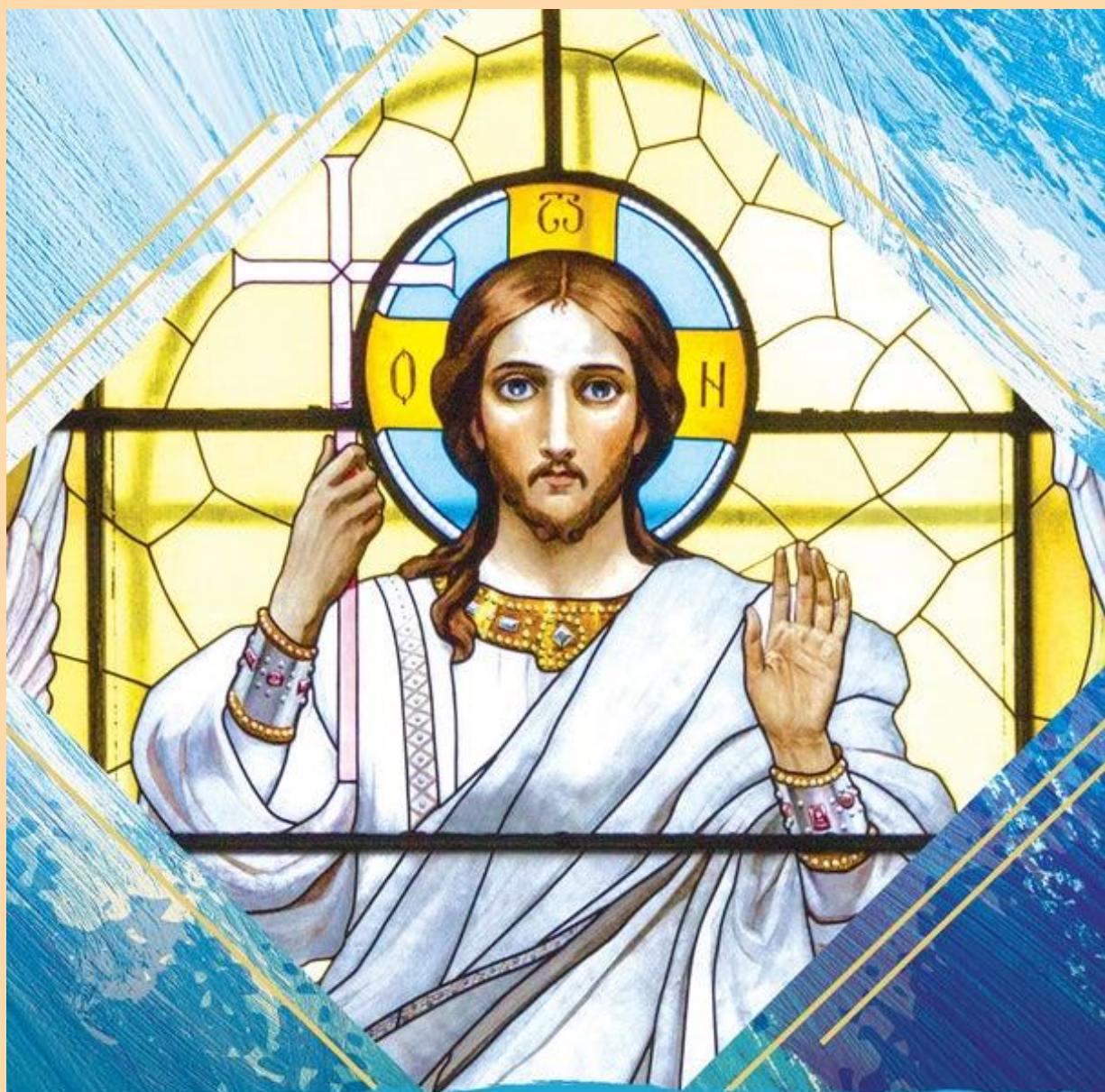

A Message from Fr. Matt

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

"Have no anxiety at all..." That's what St. Paul says in our Second Reading for today. Sometimes I just want to punch him! No anxiety?? Are you kidding Paul? How can we have no anxiety? Our world is crazy. We don't know who to believe. One channel says one thing, the next one says the complete opposite. Our lives, our kids, our families, our church, everything is under attack! Just read that billboard at the bottom of Bonniebrook! Paul couldn't understand, could he? His world wasn't anything like ours. Except....it was. Paul wrote that line from a prison cell. He was imprisoned for speaking about God. His own people, the ones he grew up with, wanted to kill him. His country was occupied by a foreign power. He had started many communities and introduced them to Jesus, but he couldn't be with them now. He heard they were fighting among themselves. All he could do was write them letters. Paul had every right to be filled with anxiety. But he wasn't. Why not? What was Paul's secret?

The First Reading and the Gospel today tell a similar story about a vineyard. Both stories urge Israel and thereby us, to bear good fruit. The Prophet Isaiah and the Lord are trying to wake the leaders of Israel up. God has done all that is needed for Israel to bear good fruit, yet Israel has not. What more could God do? These readings are a warning. Either you change your ways and bring forth good fruit Israel, or God will let someone else do it! Well...that doesn't fit with "have no anxiety at all", does it? Why would the Church choose to group these readings together? Are we supposed to have anxiety or not?

What if I told you that these readings are perfectly matched? Sometimes the Second Reading has very little connection to the First and the Gospel, but I think in this week's case they actually do. So many times, when we are faced with tough situations, we feel anger and anxiety. Let's take for instance the state of our local church. We have been through so much in the last few years and now we are in this place that is so challenging. What are we doing? Why are we doing what we are doing? How could we possibly do what we are being asked to do? Believe me, I think these things a lot. Do you feel angry about it? Do you have anxiety about our future? Or maybe think about the political world. Are you excited for the presidential election next year? I kind of dread it. All of the division and bluster that is on its way from both sides, each who think the other is the worst. There is going to be a lot of anger in the air. It is just what we do. Do you feel anxiety about it?

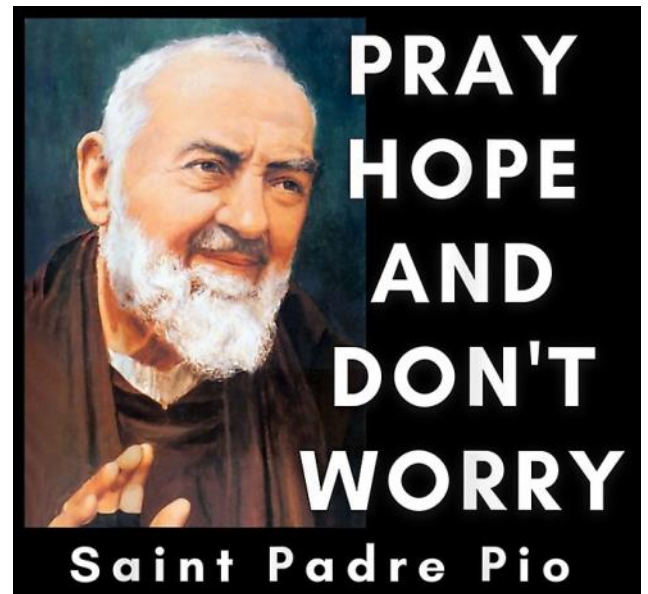
The Readings for this week give us two options. Either let the anxiety and anger rule us and turn us into violent, at least in words, people like the tenants in the Gospel, or "have no anxiety at all." Which would you choose? I think I'd go with St. Paul. You?

Now notice that St. Paul isn't saying that there is nothing to have anxiety about. He had plenty of things. But he is saying that we don't need to have anxiety. How is that possible? Prayer, petition and thanksgiving. Mother Teresa used to pray a Novena of Memorare's, but she would pray 10 of them instead of 9. The extra one was in thanksgiving that God had heard and answered her prayer. She knew that God was so good, so much bigger than any of our worries, that God would answer our prayers and give us just what we need. She KNEW it! She believed it! So too did St. Paul. So, all that he could have been worried about, he wasn't, because he knew that God was good and God was in control. Padre Pio said it beautifully; "Pray, hope and don't worry."

I was telling Adam, our Seminarian, earlier this week about a time when I was in college and faced with speaking to a group in a moment where I was totally unprepared and not in the best state of mind. I felt so much pressure and was not sure I could do it. I finally told God that I could not do it and that if He wanted me to do it, He was going to have to do it through me and for me. And guess what? God did it!

This is what St. Paul means by "have no anxiety at all." God knows what we are going through. God knows what we face. Pray about what's going on in you and around you. Don't hold anything back from God. Know that there is reason to Hope. God is bigger than anything you face. Don't worry. He's got this.

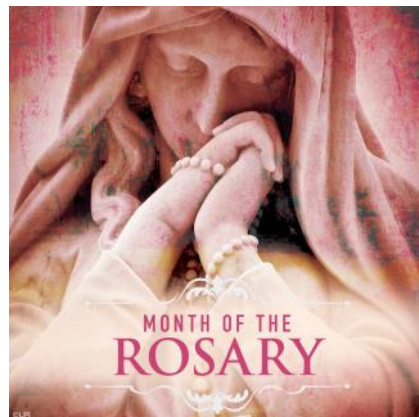

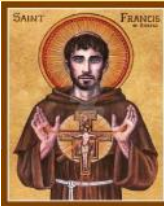
