a Message from Fr. Math

Dear Brothers and Sisters

Have you ever been to a desert? I guess I kind of have. I have been to Arizona a few times. My Aunt Susie and Uncle Bud used to live in Tucson and my parents used to go rent a place near them for a few weeks in the winter after my dad retired. It is a beautiful area but I'm not sure I could live there. It kind of looks like you're on the moon. One of my college buddies got married in Phoenix. We all stayed at a pretty fancy hotel out there and I remember going to meet my buddies at the pool. I forgot to bring flip flops so I had running shoes on. Once I got to the pool, I kicked my shoes off and stood up on the patio around the pool and I am pretty sure I seared my feet like a good steak! I didn't realize that the patio would get so hot! But that is the way it is in the desert. Nice to visit. Bring flip flops if you do. Pretty sure I wouldn't want to live there.

I noticed something in the Readings for this week. I think there is a mistake in punctuation. Maybe I am wrong but, did you notice that in the Gospel, St. Mark says that the Prophet Isaiah says "A voice of one crying out in the desert: Prepare the way of the Lord..." However, in the First Reading, Isaiah actually says "A voice cries out: In the desert prepare the way of the Lord!" Did you catch the difference? St. Mark is identifying John the Baptist as the one whose voice is crying out in the desert. That is how Mark introduces John. But Isaiah is saying that a voice is telling us that we should go to the desert to prepare the way for the Lord. That is different, isn't it? Of course, we need to remember that neither Mark nor Isaiah wrote in English and so both of these passages are translations and all translation involves interpretation, so maybe this is nothing. Maybe it doesn't matter. We do believe that the coming of John the Baptist was foretold by the prophets. He was indeed the voice that cried out in the desert. But...what if this isn't nothing? What if the message really is that in order to prepare the way of the Lord, we need to do it in the desert?

I have to admit, I had never really noticed this difference before. I always just heard Isaiah and assumed that he was writing about John, and honestly, I don't think that this is wrong. But with that said, what do you think it means when the prophet says "In the desert prepare the way of the Lord"? Go to a hot place that burns your bare feet and looks like a moonscape? Maybe a good question to ask is, what does "the desert" mean in Scripture? In some ways the desert is a place of testing. Jesus was tested for 40 days in the desert. Israel was tested for 40 years in the desert after the Exodus. The desert can be a place of banishment and punishment. It can be seen as a place of desolation. So, is this what we are being encouraged to do? It sounds awful.

The thing is, to Israel, the desert was not only a place of testing and desolation, it was also a place of great intimacy with God. When Israel was in the desert, God was with them. There was no buffer. God's presence was in the Ark of the Covenant and the Ark was with Israel. They had never been closer to God. God literally was in a tent with them. Did you know what the Hebrew word for tent is? Tabernacle. Isn't that something? Isaiah is calling Israel back to the intimacy and simplicity of the time when God dwelt in the tabernacle with them. Wait...are we in the desert? God is in the tabernacle with us, right? Indeed, God is. I think that the answer is that we can be in the desert if we are willing. God is here and desires intimacy with us. We need to realize where we are and make way for Him.

There is actually something called "Desert Spirituality" and in it, the desert is called "The Place of Great Undoing." Going to the desert or realizing that you are in the desert can lead you to a more honest understanding of yourself. It is a place where ego is put aside, because how can you be full of yourself when you know that God, THE GOD, is sitting right in the room with you? If we are honest, we couldn't. The desert is a place where all of our dreams and goals for ourselves can stand side by side with the dreams and goals that God has for us. If we are honest, God's are better. In the desert, we can see clearly who we are, not who we think we are, not who we want others to think

we are, but who our Maker says we are. The desert is the place of great undoing. It is the place of humble and honest seeing. It is the place of greatest intimacy with God.

This week let us realize where we stand. We stand on holy ground. We stand in the desert. We have an intimacy with God, in the Tabernacle and inside our bodies when we receive Him in the Eucharist, that most people in the history of the world have never had. The desert is available to us. It is a good place to be. It is a place that will allow you to see yourself and all that is going on in your life, in a most honest way. Stand in the desert. Be honest. Be real. You are so intimately close to God. Do you realize it?

In the desert prepare the way of the Lord!



DID YOU KNOW? THE ADVENT WREATH



Advent comes from the Latin verb "ven" to come. The Advent Wreath is thought to be German in origin. The circle shape of the wreath represents Christ's being eternal. No beginning and no end. Materials used for the wreath come from nature or materials readily available. Evergreens are popular because they symbolize "life" even in the dead of winter. The candles represent Christ as the Light of the World. Three purple candles represent prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifice. One rose candle representing rejoicing. Some people include a white "Christ Candle" in the center of the wreath that is lit on Christmas Eve in anticipation of Christmas.
