# A Message from Fr. Math

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

There is a seminary in Washington DC that has an image of a pregnant Blessed Virgin Mary on the pulpit. It is so beautiful. It is fitting too because the Word of God that is proclaimed from that pulpit is filled with the living God, just as Mary is in the image. I don't know if people always did this, but these days, whenever I see a photo on Instagram or Facebook, or get a Christmas Card and there is a mom who is expecting, she always seems to have her hand on the baby in her belly. Mary is doing the same thing in the image on that pulpit. Those moms in the pictures always seem to have looks of joy on their faces. Mary looks filled with joy too.

At St. Vincent Seminary in Latrobe, there is a statue of the Blessed Mother that is very different. I think that I have told you before about this statue. When I was in school, the new chapel had just been completed. One of the last touches was the statue of Mary. It had been made specifically for our chapel and we were so excited to see it. When it came, I was surprised. Mary looked bulky and older. She had her right hand on her cheek. We dubbed her "Our Lady of the toothache"! What I didn't realize was that this statue was based on the image of Mary in the San Damiano Cross, the same cross from which Christ spoke to St. Francis. The same cross which hung in the church that St. Clare and her sisters lived, in Assisi. What I missed at first, when I was so focused on her right hand, seemingly soothing a sore tooth, was what her left hand was doing. She was pointing to Jesus on the Cross!

Today we celebrate Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is a Latin word, a command really, that means "rejoice." It is important to note that this is an imperative, a command from the Lord. We are not told today that it would be good if we rejoiced, we are commanded to do so. But what if our situation in life makes it hard to rejoice? This can be a stressful time of year. Are we really supposed to "rejoice always" as St. Paul says in the Second Reading? If so, how?

In each of our Readings for this week, the same answer is given. In the First Reading, the Prophet Isaiah says "I rejoice heartily in the Lord." In the Responsorial Psalm we hear the words of Our Lady; "my spirit rejoices in God my savior." In the Second Reading, St. Paul says that rejoicing, praying and giving thanks is "the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." In the Gospel, John the Baptist rejoices not in his own success but in "the one who is coming after me."

The two statues of which I spoke earlier carry the same message. In both, Mary points to the reason for her joy. Neither is focused on herself. Both point to Jesus. This is the common message of each of the readings as well. Look to Jesus. He is the reason for joy. Not our lives, not our successes. Jesus. If we would respond to the command to rejoice by pointing at our lives and asking "How can we? Look at what is going on!" God would say to us, hey pal, you're pointing at the wrong thing! Point to Jesus. Look to Jesus. Hand your worries to Jesus. Thank Jesus for all that He has done. Praise Him. Don't be trapped in the prison of self concern. Let Jesus be concerned for you. You just look to Him and rejoice!
